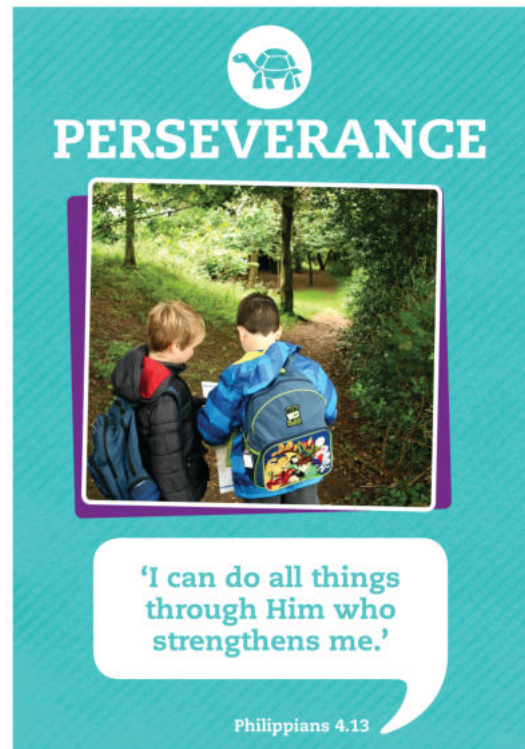

## CSPA Visits Narnia

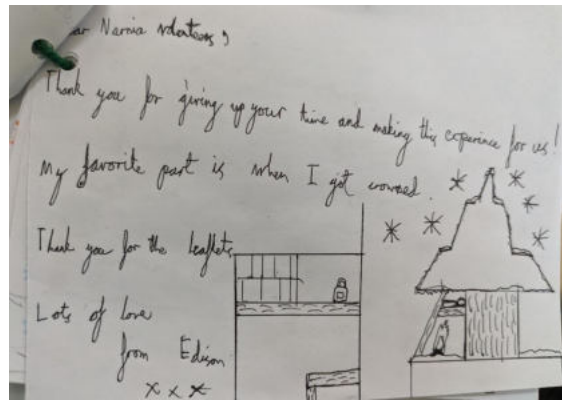

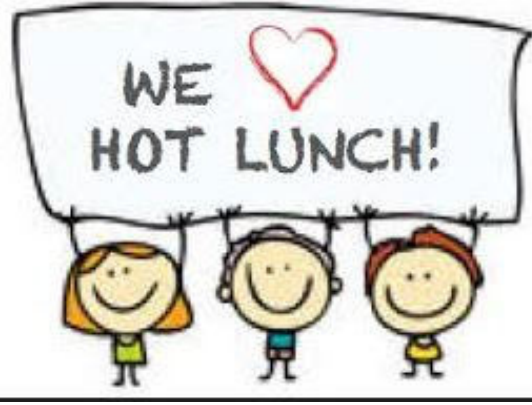
## PTA Ball

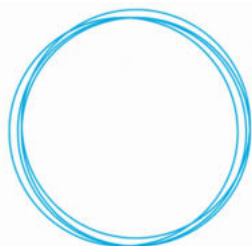
