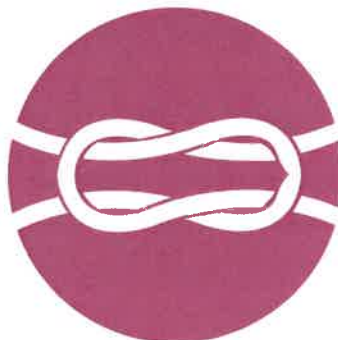

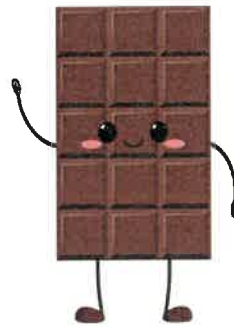
Sharing success in the local community

Online Safety

In the newsletter, we like to take the opportunity to support parents. We will be sharing information about keeping your children safe online and when using devices. This week, we are sharing a poster about WhatsApp.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about WHATSAPP

WhatsApp is the world's most popular messaging service, with around two billion users exchanging texts, photos, videos and documents, as well as making voice and video calls. Its end-to-end encryption means messages can only be viewed by the sender and any recipients, not even WhatsApp can read them. Updates to its privacy policy in 2021 (involving sharing data with parent company Facebook) caused millions to leave the app, but the new policy was widely misinterpreted - it only related to WhatsApp's business features, not to personal messages.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- SCAMS**: Friends occasionally send WhatsApp messages pretending to offer prizes - encouraging the user to click on a link to win. Other common schemes involve entrusting someone from their WhatsApp subscription has run out (leading to type them into disclosing payment details) or impersonating a friend or relative and asking for money to be transferred to help with an emergency.
- DISAPPEARING MESSAGES**: Users can set WhatsApp messages to disappear in 24 hours, 7 days or 90 days by default. Photos and videos can also be instructed to disappear after the recipient has viewed them. These files can't be saved or forwarded - so if your child was sent an important message, it would be difficult to prove any wrongdoing. However, the receiver can take a screenshot and save that as evidence.
- ENABLING FAKE NEWS**: WhatsApp has unfortunately been linked to accelerating the spread of dangerous rumors. In late in 2018, some outbreaks of mob violence appear to have been sparked by false allegations being shared on the app. WhatsApp itself took steps to prevent its users circulating hazardous theories and speculation in the early weeks of the Covid-19 pandemic.

POTENTIAL CYBERBULLYING: Group chat and video calls are great for connecting with multiple people in WhatsApp, but there is always the potential for someone's feelings to be hurt by an unkind comment or joke. The 'only admin' feature gives the admin(s) of a group control over who can send messages. They can, for example, block people from posting in a chat, which could make a child feel excluded and upset.

CONTACT FROM STRANGERS: To start a WhatsApp chat, you only need the mobile number of the person you want to message (the other person also needs to have the app). WhatsApp can access the address book on someone's device and recognise which of their contacts also use the app. So if your child has ever given their phone number to someone they don't know, that person could see it to contact them via WhatsApp.

LOCATION SHARING: The 'live location' feature lets users share their current whereabouts, allowing friends to see their movements. WhatsApp describes it as 'temporary' and requires you to set people know where you are. It is a useful method for a young person to let loved ones know they're safe - but if they used it in a chat with people they don't know, they would be exposing their location to them, too.

Advice for Parents & Carers

- CREATE A SAFE PROFILE**: It can seem someone would need a child's phone number to add them as a contact. It's also worth checking a young person's profile settings to restrict who can see their photo and status. The options are 'everyone', 'my contacts' and ' nobody' - choosing one of the latter two ensures that your child's profile is better protected.
- EXPLAIN ABOUT BLOCKING**: If your child receives spam or offensive messages, either as files from a contact, they should block them using 'settings' in the chat. Communication from a blocked contact won't show up on their device and stays Uncollected. Blocking someone does not remove them from your child's contact list - so they also need to be deleted from the address book.
- REPORT POTENTIAL SCAMS**: Young people shouldn't engage with any message that feels suspicious or too good to be true. When your child receives a message from an unknown number for the first time, they're not given the option to report it as spam. If the number seems to be a friend or relative, ask that person on their usual number to verify it really is them, or if it's someone trying to trick your child.
- LEAVE A GROUP**: If your child is in a group chat that is making them feel uncomfortable, or has been added to a group that they don't want to be part of, they can use WhatsApp's group settings to leave. If someone adds a group, the admin can add them back in again; if they leave a second time, it is permitted.
- THINK ABOUT LOCATION**: If your child needs to use the 'live location' function to show you or one of their friends where they are, advise them to share their location only for as long as they need to. WhatsApp gives a range of 'live location' options, and your child should manually stop sharing their position as soon as it is no longer needed.
- DELETE ACCIDENTAL MESSAGES**: If your child posts a message they want to delete, WhatsApp allows the user seven minutes to erase it. Tap and hold on the message, choose 'delete' and the 'delete for everyone' option. However, it's important to remember that recipients may have seen (and taken a screenshot of) a message before it was deleted.
- CHECK THE FACTS**: You can now fact-check WhatsApp messages that have been forwarded at least five times. By double-tapping the forwarding glass icon to the right of the message, from there, your child can search a Google search and decide for themselves whether the message was true or not.

Year 5 Virtual Visit: Juggling Scientist Dr Ken

We are excited to announce a special event for Year 5 pupils that will take place on the 28th of November - a Virtual Forces Workshop! This workshop will

provide our children with a fun and engaging opportunity to recap their science learning from last term while exploring the fascinating world of circus performers and how they use forces to entertain their audiences.

During this virtual workshop, pupils will have the chance to witness first hand the physics behind the gravity-defying acts performed by circus professionals. Through interactive demonstrations and engaging activities, they will discover how forces play a crucial role in creating the captivating performances we all enjoy.

To make this workshop possible, a nominal donation of £3 per student has been added to Parent Pay. Your contribution will go towards covering the expenses associated with organising this experience. The Virtual Forces Workshop will be conducted entirely online during the school day. The children were engrossed in the story, and their enthusiasm was truly contagious. It was a fantastic opportunity for them to explore new literary adventures and expand their imaginations.



For those who are unfamiliar with "Grimwood," it is an enchanting tale that definitely took the children on a magical journey through a mysterious woodland. The story captivates young minds with its

delightful characters, engaging plot twists, and heartfelt messages. We highly recommend adding it to your family's reading list!

The year 5 team would also like to extend our gratitude to Mrs Brown who volunteered her time and made this session possible.

Year 3 Iron Man Junk Modelling

We will be studying The Iron Man by Ted Hughes in English this term, and are planning to complete a Design and Technology project, designing and building our own Iron Man junk models over the coming weeks. We will be building these on Monday 27th November, and we therefore have a few requests:

1) Please start cleaning and saving up some of the items below. If there is an item that your child particularly wants to use in their own model, please ensure their name is written on it. We will ask for these to be brought in the week before (w/c 20.11.23):

- Plastic milk cartons
- Bottle tops from eg. milk/juice/squash/water bottles
- Egg boxes
- Pots from eg. yoghurt, cream etc. (small and large)
- Cardboard boxes (cereal boxes, juice cartons, boxes of varied sizes/shapes)
- Kitchen roll tubes (toilet rolls cannot be accepted for hygiene reasons!)
- Tubes from inside foil/cling film/baking paper/wrapping paper
- Plastic tubs from fruit/veg (eg. grapes)
- Any other junk that you believe may be suitable (please do not bring in anything that has stored meat or nuts, no glass, and nothing with sharp edges eg. tin cans)

In previous years, we have had several bags full of junk remaining after the activity which we have been unable to dispose of in school due to the quantity, so please be aware your child may return home after the activity with some of the junk to be recycled at home!

2) If you are able, please provide a full roll of tin foil for your child - again, we will ask for these to be brought in during the week before.

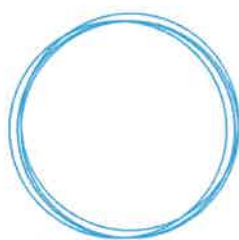
