If you are a Year 6 parent, please check in your inbox for an email sent to you from me regarding the secondary transfer test results issued later today.

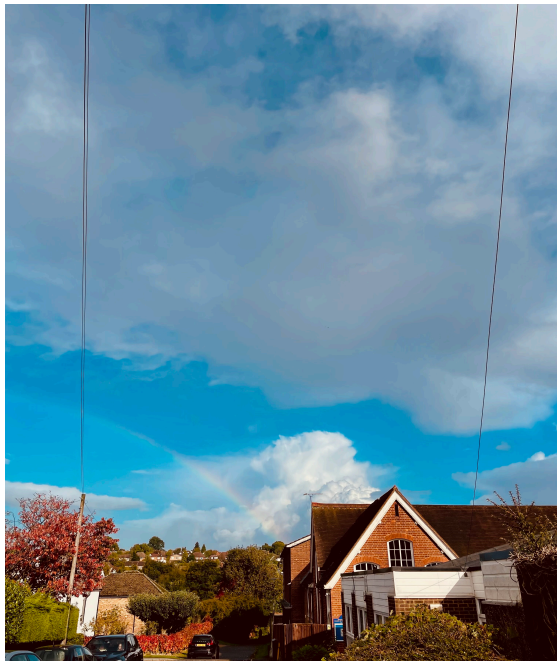
Finally, thank you parents for taking the time to vote in our recent parent governor election. You can read about the outcome in a message from our Chair of Governors below.

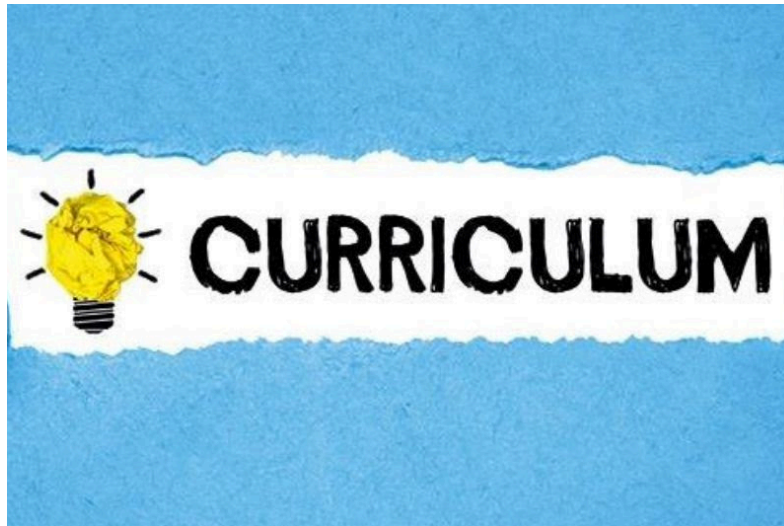

Dear parents and carers,

On Friday 18th October we are having a TT Rock Stars launch day in school! On this day the Y3 children will be participating in times table games/battles in which they will they can explore the website, play other classes/children in the year group and try and earn rewards through their knowledge of the times tables. We will also be playing some other multiplication games and creating Rockstar versions of ourselves.

The games that they play are tailored to their individual needs, as determined by the questions they were able to answer on their baseline test, therefore they won't find it too challenging for their needs or be at a disadvantage in any way!

On the launch day, children are invited to come in to school dressed as their rock stars, if they wish to. There is no charge for this! It is purely for fun and to get children excited about using TT Rockstars!

Included with this letter is an information leaflet for parents which explains what the different games are that the children can play on TT Rockstars. Hopefully you will find this useful!

Your child's should have had their log in details sent home already, but please ask your child's class teacher if you can't find it.

Having a secure knowledge of the times tables is vitally important for the children, as it helps them to work efficiently when calculating in all areas of maths. Children are expected to be secure in the 2, 5 and 10 x tables by the end of year 2, and in year 3 we focus on the 3, 4 and 8s. By the end of year 4 the children should know all tables up to the 12.

We would encourage all children to practise their tables as much as they can at home, whether on TT Rockstars or any other way! If you need any support with this, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Arts Week

We are delighted to tell you that the much-loved CSPA Arts Week is back! The theme for this year is Great British Bands. Your children will dive into topics such as art, music, and fashion linked to bands through the decades. They will also join in with one dance workshop, during which they will learn a dance from

one of our chosen bands.

Arts Week has always proved to be a high point of the year. Each class will spend the day in a different year group from Tuesday to Thursday, having the chance to get to know new teachers, or spend the day with a previous one. On Friday, we will end the week with a lively performance from our CSPA Teacher Band.

No Maths and English homework will be set this week, but each child is asked to complete an Arts Week Diary, showing all that they have learned and experienced during the week. This is to be completed at home, in any way they would like, and brought back into school on the Monday after half term. If your children needs to take any paper home, their class teacher will be happy to provide it. Each child who completes their diary will receive 3 raffle tickets, and have the chance to have it displayed in The Junction.

As we have workshops during the week, and use a range of creative materials, we are asking for a donations of £4 for each child please. You will find this on your Parent Pay account soon. Please could you also ensure your child has a complete pencil case for the week, and a large cover-up they can wear over their uniform during any messy activities.

We are all very much looking forward to Arts Week, and we hope your child remembers it for many years to come.

ParentPay

To ensure the smooth running of clubs, music lessons, activities and trips at Chalfont St Peter Academy we use a secure online payment website called ParentPay. Parents are asked to make all payments to school via the ParentPay website rather than sending cash or cheques into the school office.

New to ParentPay?

You will need to create your secure online account by visiting www.parentpay.com and using the unique activation username and password

which was sent home via a letter with all new Year 3 children last week and emailed to other new families. You will then be prompted to change these to something more memorable and private to you. If you have two or more children at a ParentPay school, you only need to activate one account to create your 'main account' and then add your other children via the **Add a child tab** on your home page.

Already have a ParentPay account?

If you already have a ParentPay account, either with our school or another ParentPay school, you can simply login to that account and add your other children via the **Add a child** tab on your home page. You will need the activation username and password to do this.

Please visit www.parentpay.com and activate your account via the **Account login** area on the home page of the site.

ParentPay holds an electronic record of your payments to view at a later date. Once you have activated your account you can make online payments straight away.

Please do not hesitate to contact the school office if you need assistance. Your support in using ParentPay will help the school enormously, thank you.

PTA Hot Lunch

Our first PTA hot lunch of the school year is on **Friday 25th October 2024**. The hot lunch is kindly being supplied again this time by The Village Chippy in Chalfont St Giles. As usual, the choices are fishcake, chicken nuggets, plain meat sausage or a vegetarian sausage. If you wish for your child to have a hot lunch please login in to ParentPay www.parentpay.com, select the 'hot lunch' item stating your child's food preference: fishcake, chicken nuggets, plain meat sausage or a vegetarian sausage in the comments box.

The final deadline for ordering is Monday 21st October, at 9am.

Unfortunately, no orders can be accepted after this date. Please do not request a hot lunch after this date.

The cost of the lunch is £6.00. If you wish to make an additional donation to the school, you can do so by entering a higher amount in ParentPay (see instructions below). Proceeds over and above the cost of the lunch go towards purchasing valuable items for the school. As you know, we are currently fundraising for two projects – the school refurbishment project and the curriculum design project.

When you select the item to make payment, you will see two options:

- Pay full amount (£10.00)
- Choose payment amount

To pay for the hot lunch select 'Choose payment amount' and type the amount you wish to pay into the box (minimum is £6, maximum is £10).

Please note if payment is not made, an order will not be placed for your child.

Children are under no obligation to have a hot lunch – some will prefer their usual lunchbox so please do not feel under any pressure to include your child.

If you are entitled to free school meals please ensure that you go onto your Parent Pay account to select your child's meal choice.

I am grateful to one or our parents, Ms Wagner, and other parents as well as members of school staff for working together to provide this firm favourite for the children.

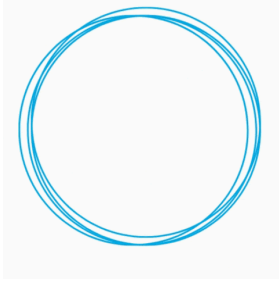
