Arrangements for Adverse Weather Conditions

I am writing to remind you of the arrangements should adverse weather conditions mean that Chalfont St Peter C of E Academy must be fully or partially closed.

Last week, we were met with some heavy snow around drop off time and the Buckinghamshire Local Authority have provided additional guidance about keeping warm and well and staying safe in cold weather which I am sharing with you below:

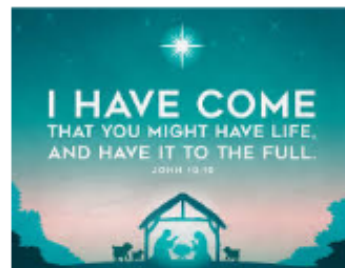

Did you know that our local library has over 11,000 books available to borrow, as well as a number of other very useful facilities?

Library Facilities:

Chalfont St Peter Community Library has a range of facilities available to the public including:

- Public Computers on both floors
- Photocopying, scanning and printing
- Free Wi-Fi and free internet access
- Free online resources
- Access to the free E-library

How to borrow:

Adults and children aged 13 or over can apply for their own library membership card from the library or from the website. Children under 13 need permission from their parent to get a library card. They also need parents' permission to use computers in the library. Children can take out up to 30 books at any one time – yes, up to 30 at any one time! There is a dyslexia friendly book section. Books are available for all ages, abilities and interests of readers. The library is also a place where children can do homework and use the wifi.

Opening hours: 10am to 5pm Tuesday, Wednesday Friday and 10am-1pm Saturday.

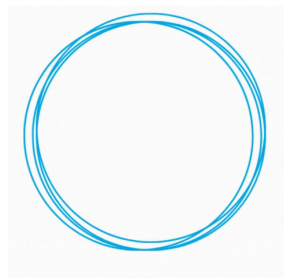
