Headteacher's Welcome

Welcome back after the half term break. I hope you all enjoyed a happy week and the chance to recharge and reset. The second half of the spring term has much to look forward to including World Book Day and our PTA Spring Fayre - more about both events is shared later in the newsletter.

May I take this opportunity to remind you of our [uniform policy](#). In particular, we would greatly appreciate your support with ensuring that your child does not wear earrings to school so our policy is followed fairly and consistently. Thank you.

Sadly, the PTA Quiz arranged for this evening was cancelled in the week due to low ticket sales. It's a shame to cancel events as they not only raise much-needed funds for the school but they bring our school community together too. I

Walk To School and Be Healthy Week is next week (3rd - 7th March)

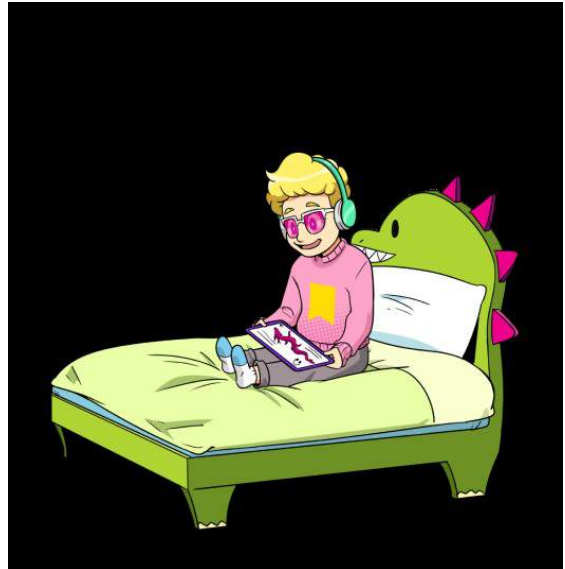
This aims to be a healthy week for our children and the environment in which they are living.

World Book Day And Reading For Pleasure

Thursday, 6th March.

World Book Day is fast approaching. The children will be receiving their World Book Day token to spend in bookshops on a selection of World Book Day special books.

At CSPA this year, we are inviting the children to come to school either dressed in book-related 'fancy-dress', or in 'cosy clothes', which they would feel comfortable reading in (not pyjamas please).

If your child usually comes to school in PE kit on a Thursday, please could they wear as much of this as possible as part of their costume or cosy clothes, with any additional items of kit accompanying them in a named bag, so that they can change into it for their games lesson or activity.

We will also be holding our annual World Book Day Book Swap, so please start to think about which books from your current collection you might like to donate to the book swap, in order to make room on your bookshelves for the new, swapped ones you will choose in school on World Book Day.

We will be asking the children to bring in their books to swap on Monday 3rd, Tuesday 4th and Wednesday 5th March. They will be given a token in exchange for their books, which they will then be able to use to 'purchase' new books at the book swap on Thursday, 6th March during the school day.

It would be really helpful if the children could please bring a plastic or fabric bag into school with them on World Book Day, to carry home all the new books they have chosen at the book swap.

We support World Book Day because we believe in its aims. This year, World Book Day is focussing on 'Reading Your Way.'

'Reading Your Way' encourages everyone to let go of reading pressures and expectations, and empowers children and young people to have fun discovering reading on their own terms. This helps to build a love of reading for pleasure.

Please read below for some more detailed information about the benefits of reading for pleasure.

Our mission is to promote reading for pleasure, offering every child and young

person the opportunity to have a book of their own. Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income.

World Book Day defines Reading for Pleasure as:

Feeling sense of satisfaction or pleasure by engaging with chosen reading material in their free time.

We want to see more children with a life-long habit of reading for pleasure and the improved life chances this brings them.

Six Elements - One Reading Superpower

The evidence base shows there are 6 building elements which support a child to read for pleasure

Being read to regularly

Having books at home and at school

Having a choice in what to read

Finding time to read

Having trusted help to find a book

Making reading FUN!

These 6 elements shape and guide everything World Book Day does.



Why Reading For Pleasure? - The Evidence

Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income. Key outcomes are listed below.

- Improvement in vocabulary in comparison to non-readers (Millenium Cohort Study)
- Correlation between regularity of reading for pleasure and ability in reading each reinforcing the other as students get older (Cremin 2019, Torppa 2020)
- Better performance in subjects other than English (Millenium Cohort Study)
- Reading for pleasure is one of the most important predictors of test scores at age 16, regardless of background (OECD)
- There is a strong correlation between regular reading for Pleasure and Mental Wellbeing which is separate from other predictors (NLT 2018)

- Reading improves a child's empathy skills (Oatly 2016)
- Interventions developing Reading for Pleasure attitudes (offering book choice and time to read rather than instruction) have a greater influence on reading ability than reading lessons for older children/adults (Greenberg 2014)

The 'Reading Stack' is part of an exciting new CSPA initiative to help children track their reading progress and explore a variety of genres throughout the year.

Some children have their Reading Stack on paper to be stuck into their reading records, while others may not have had their reading record available. If your child didn't stick it in at school, please can you do this at home? The Reading Stack is designed to encourage students to discover what genres interest them most and to try out different kinds of books. Here's how it works:

- Each child has a Reading Stack with six different genres (such as mystery, adventure, fantasy, etc.) and ten books listed under each genre.
- As they read books, they can colour in a book on the stack that corresponds to the genre of the book they've read.
- Each genre has a specific colour, and when your child writes the title of the book in their reading diary, they will place a small dot of the

corresponding colour next to the title.

This method not only helps track their reading preferences but also encourages them to explore books they might not have considered before. We've included a list of suggested books for each genre that are age-appropriate, but children are welcome to explore other titles within each genre too. The aim is to inspire them to read for fun and broaden their literary horizons!

Please remember, there is no expectation to finish the entire stack by the end of the year—this is about encouraging as much reading as possible at a comfortable pace.

We're excited to see how this initiative inspires our young readers and hope they enjoy both the journey of discovery and the fun of tracking their progress.

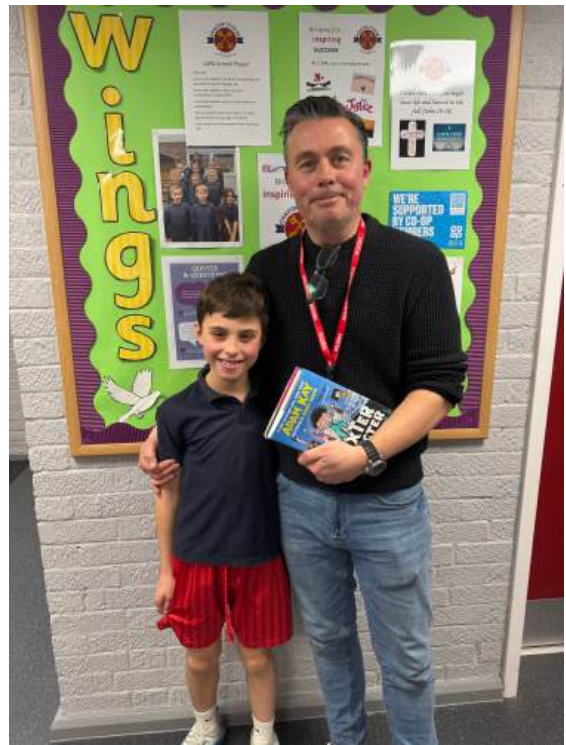
Year 5's Mystery Reader Magic!

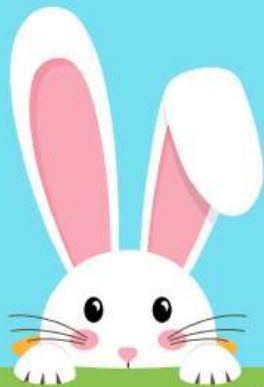
