Class Assemblies

We are delighted to share plans welcoming you to join some of our CSPA assemblies and collective worship. Throughout the school year, every class and their teacher/s will be creating and presenting an assembly to the rest of their year group and you are invited to come into school and watch your child's class assembly. This is a wonderful opportunity for children to showcase their learning, build their confidence and experience performing and presenting in front of others. We are thrilled to be opening our doors and welcoming parents into school for another chance to be part of your child's CSPA journey, build positive relationships and engage with our whole school community.

The class assemblies will be on Fridays starting promptly at 9:10am and finishing at 9:30am. You are welcome to arrive at 9am. The assembly will be shared in our school hall.

To give you prior notice, the dates of each class assembly are shared below:

Friday 11th July 2025: Year 6 Class 10

To ensure that we do not exceed the hall's capacity and be compliant with fire regulations, we ask that a maximum of two members of each family attend the assembly. Siblings not of school age can attend but will need to sit on adults' laps. There is no need to register your attendance, please just arrive at 9am via the school office. Please note that the rest of the school will have the opportunity to also enjoy the assembly at a later time that morning.

We look forward to seeing you and welcoming you to our class assemblies.

For those children involved (a letter has been shared), the rearranged date is for Monday 14th July. All arrangements, including the venue, timings and transport remain the same.

Sports Day

As you will be aware our annual Sports Day is next week, Wednesday 9th July 2025 starting at 1pm. We are all looking forward to an enjoyable event and would like to ensure all parents are aware of the arrangements.

Please could we ask parents to ensure the following for their child:

- Children need a hat **if** it is sunny (red school hat if possible, if not any suitable one will do)
- All children need to have sun cream applied before arriving at school.
- All children need their own water bottle.

In addition to that, children need to wear their school PE kit (blue top, red shorts/skorts and white socks) and trainers to school on Wednesday. Each child will be given a coloured t-shirt to change into to represent their house.

We will keep up-to-date with any changes in the weather and share any further details should we need to. Shade will be provided for the children to rest between races. The children will need their water bottles to receive regular refills from our PTA volunteers (in the interests of reducing our use of plastic, we will not be using plastic cups). The PTA have also arranged for a refreshment van to offer hot and soft drinks. Please note this is for spectators only and not for the children.

In order to reduce the amount of physical activity on the children before their races, we will not be bringing chairs to the field from the school. Therefore, we ask you to bring your own chairs if you wish to sit in the designated area.

The programme will be circulated via email (again to save on printing costs and paper) as soon as possible. For your information, here is an approximate running order:

60m and 80m sprints

Sack race

200m

Skipping

600m

Obstacle race

Relay

For those of you new to our Sports Day, the children sit in their year groups on one side of the track to support and encourage their teammates and spectators and families sit on the other side. Please can I ask you not to go across to your child at any time without the knowledge of a staff member. We look forward to a wonderful event



Instrumental Lessons from September 2025

To enable us to plan for the next academic year, we need to gauge the interest of children wishing to continue with their lessons for **cello** and **keyboard** with Mrs White and to know whether there are any other children who would like to start lessons on either of these instruments from September 2025.

Lessons take place during the school day and from September 2025 the cost will be £315 for the year. Although you are committed to paying for the whole year you will be able to pay this in termly instalments via ParentPay according to the following schedule:

- £105 by 1 October 2025
- £105 by 1 February 2026
- £105 by 1 May 2026

From time to time children may receive individual lessons, for example to prepare for exams. There will be an additional charge for this, Mrs White will contact parents in advance to discuss if this becomes appropriate for your child.

PTA Hot Lunch - Friday 18th July

Unfortunately, no orders can be accepted after this date. Please do not request a hot lunch after this date.

The cost of the lunch is £6.00. If you wish to make an additional donation to the school, you can do so by entering a higher amount in ParentPay (see instructions below). Proceeds over and above the cost of the lunch go towards purchasing valuable items for the school. As you know, we are currently fundraising for two projects – the school refurbishment project and the curriculum design project.

When you select the item to make payment, you will see two options:

- Pay full amount (£10.00)
- Choose payment amount

To pay for the hot lunch select 'Choose payment amount' and type the amount you wish to pay into the box (minimum is £6, maximum is £10).

Please note if payment is not made, an order will not be placed for your child.

Children are under no obligation to have a hot lunch – some will prefer their usual lunchbox so please do not feel under any pressure to include your child.

If you are entitled to free school meals please ensure that you go onto your Parent Pay account to select your child's meal choice.

I am grateful to one or our parents, Miss Webster, and other parents as well as members of school staff for working together to provide this firm favourite for the children.
