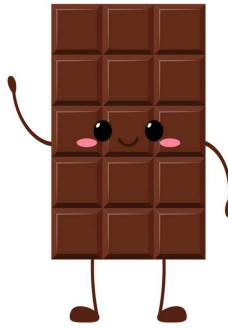

Uniform and PE Kits

As mentioned in the welcome, I have updated the Uniform Policy to reflect some minor changes made. This is particularly around wearing earrings.

Jewellery

The wearing of earrings is discouraged in school.

If parents opt for their child to wear earrings, this is on the understanding that parents take responsibility should their child have an injury as a result of having earrings in.

If parents opt for their child to wear earrings, they must be plain gold/silver studs only - hoops, dangly, shaped or jewelled earrings are not permitted. Only one pair of small studs are allowed to be worn (one earring in each ear).

Children participating in PE, sports clubs or physical activities should not come to school wearing earrings on those days. If they do, pupils will be asked to remove their earrings and put them into their school bag. Staff are not permitted to remove or insert earrings on health and safety grounds and will not be held responsible for the storage of earrings.

If your child has their ears pierced, then please ensure it is done at the beginning of the 6-week summer break giving them time to heal.

Where pierced ears are still healing within the advised 6-week period and a pupil is unable to remove their earrings, they should be taped at home using appropriate medical tape. Staff are not permitted to remove or tape earrings for pupils.

Rings, necklaces, bracelets should not be worn. Watches may be worn but not smart watches which have the ability to be used to access the internet or link to mobile phones.

There may be some exceptions to the wearing of jewellery which include medical or religious reasons. If this is the case, a written request should be sent to the child's class teacher.

Sadly this is a regular feature of our weekly newsletters. Once again, I am having to strongly urge parents to use the Church Lane Car Park for drop off and pick up. I am concerned about the safety of our families as well as many Year 6 children who are now walking to school. I have contacted the local PCSO again in the hope they may be able to offer some support. The safety of our children is paramount - reversing and driving so close to the school, where children are crossing the road is very dangerous. Please support us to keep everyone safe! If most of our parents can park respectfully and safely, so can everyone!

Parent Pay

Letters were sent home last week to all Year 3 parents and new families to the school. Please see details of instructions below to activate your account.

To ensure the smooth running of clubs, music lessons, activities and trips at Chalfont St Peter Academy we use a secure online payment website called ParentPay. Parents are asked to make all payments to school via the ParentPay website rather than sending cash or cheques into the school office.

New to ParentPay?

You will need to create your secure online account by visiting www.parentpay.com and using the unique activation username and password which will be sent home via a letter with all new Year 3 children and emailed to other new families. You will then be prompted to change these to something more memorable and private to you. If you have two or more children at a ParentPay

school, you only need to activate one account to create your 'main account' and then add your other children via the **Add a child tab** on your home page.

Already have a ParentPay account?

If you already have a ParentPay account, either with our school or another ParentPay school, you can simply login to that account and add your other children via the **Add a child** tab on your home page. You will need the activation username and password to do this.

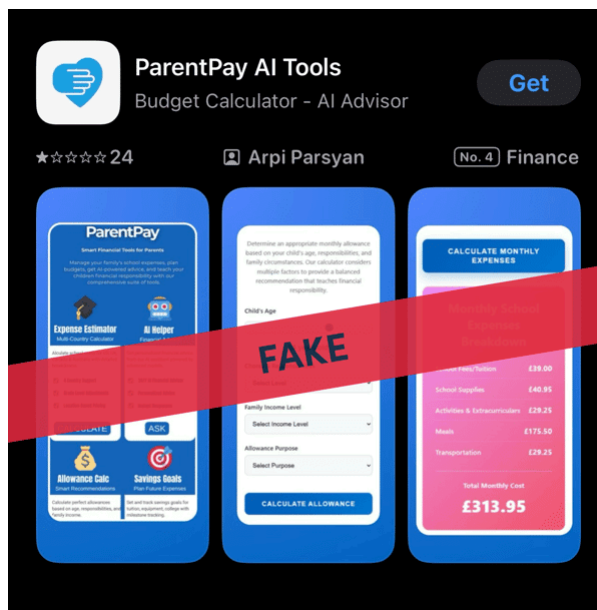
Please visit www.parentpay.com and activate your account via the **Account login** area on the home page of the site.

ParentPay holds an electronic record of your payments to view at a later date. Once you have activated your account you can make online payments straight away.

Important Notice – Fraudulent App Alert

We have been alerted to a fraudulent app in the Apple App Store that mimics ParentPay branding.



Security and safeguarding are top priorities at ParentPay Group, and we took swift action to report the app and are working closely with Apple to have it removed.

To date, we have recorded only 2 cases of affected parents.

Please be aware:

- ParentPay **does not have an app available for download from any app stores**
- To use ParentPay, parents should visit <https://www.parentpay.com/> from a mobile phone or computer
- After logging in, parents can save a shortcut onto their phone's home screen

Congratulations to the Year 6 girls and boys football teams who have progressed to the next stage of the ESFA tournament. Round 2 for both teams is in a couple of weeks!

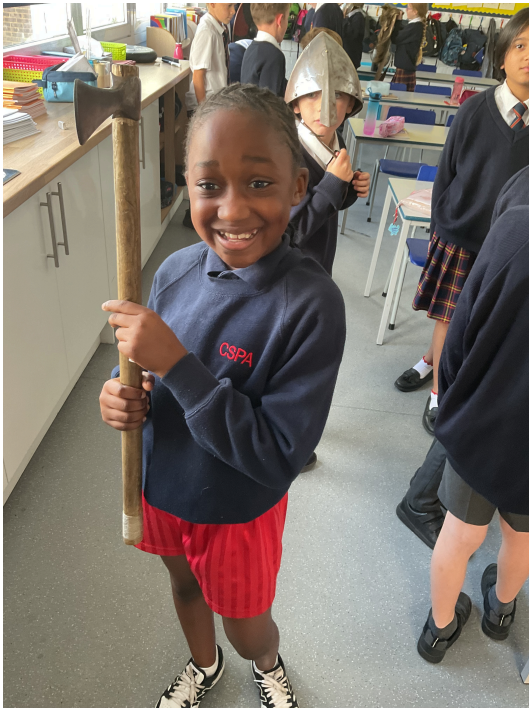
Year 5 Anglo-Saxon Workshop

Year Five have enjoyed an exciting Anglo-Saxon Day! Our visiting Saxon warrior took us on a journey through time from the arrival of the invaders around AD450, all the way through to their dramatic final defeat in 1066.

The children enjoyed taking part in a battle formation and tactics workshop, trying out different techniques with shields and spears, making tough decisions in a Witan (a form of parliament) and challenging themselves playing Anglo-Saxon strategy games such as Hnefatafl. Now we're looking forward to next year's Tudor Day, when we will be visited by Henry VIII himself.

The cost for this workshop is £9, and it will take place at school. This has been added to ParentPay.





YEAR 4 OSMINGTON BAY RESIDENTIAL TRIP 6TH - 8TH MAY 2026

After another hugely successful visit to Osmington Bay in Dorset with the children of Year 4 last summer we are delighted to be planning a return visit in May 2026.

This will be residential for 2 nights, with the party leaving school on Wednesday 6th May and returning on Friday 8th May 2026.

Whilst we stay at Osmington Bay, the children will take part in a range of exciting activities which could include – archery, abseiling, climbing, zip wire, giant swing to name but a few, all conducted by experienced leaders in a safe environment.

The children's accommodation will be in groups of 4 with en suite facilities for each room. All meals are included with a good selection of hot and cold menus. PGL is able to cater for all dietary requirements.

At this moment in time we need to confirm our booking with PGL. To reserve a place for your child, please could you complete the Google form [CLICK HERE](#) and make a deposit payment of £50 via Parentpay by 1st October. This deposit is non-refundable.

The cost of the trip is £315 per pupil inclusive of travel, full board accommodation and equipment. Should there be any difficulties in making payments, a confidential chat with myself may enable us to secure support where it is needed. If this is the case, please do not hesitate to contact me.

We would ask that the deposit of £50.00 be paid by ParentPay at www.parentpay.com by the 1st October. The deposit is non-refundable. The remaining £265 needs to be paid by 1st April 2026, and we would ask parents to pay at least the minimum instalments by the following dates:

£50 by 1st November 2025

£50 by 1st December 2025

£50 by 1st February 2026

£50 by 1st March 2026

£65 by 1st April 2026

Could I please ask you to respond to say if you would not wish your child to attend. If children do not attend, provision is made in school for them for the 3 days.

Following the meeting for Year 6 parents, I am delighted to confirm with you the provisional details for our Year 6 residential trip with Rock UK to the Summit Centre in South Wales.

Depart Chalfont St Peter: Monday 8th June 2026 (time to be confirmed but approximately 9:30-10:00am)

Return Chalfont St Peter: Friday 12th June 2026 (time to be confirmed but approximately 2:00-2:30pm)

The total cost of the trip is £470.

If you would like to reserve a place for your child on the above proposed trip to Wales in June next year, please could you complete a Google form by [clicking here](#) and pay a deposit of £80 via Parent Pay by Friday 24th October 2025. This will be non-refundable in the event that the trip goes ahead. The remaining £390 needs to be paid by 1st May 2026, and we would ask parents to pay at least the minimum instalments by the following dates:

£80 by the 1st December 2025

£80 by the 1st February 2026

£80 by the 1st March 2026

£80 by the 1st April 2026

Final payment of £70 by the 1st May 2026

In the meeting, I encouraged any families who may be concerned about paying for the trip to contact me confidentially so that financial hardship is not a reason for not joining the trip. There are a few options we can explore together (including alternative payment plans and bursary funds) and I urge you to contact me to discuss further should you need to as soon as possible. You can do so via the school office either by calling or by email.

If you have any questions/concerns and you and/or your child would like to discuss the trip with me, I am very happy to do so.

I cannot emphasise enough what a wonderful trip for the children this is. Not only does it create unforgettable, lasting memories with their friends that really contributes to the final weeks of their CSPA journey, but it also develops skills in the children that aid their transition to secondary school and the next stage of their lives. It is my wish and hope for every child in Year 6 to attend and that no child misses out, so please do reach out to me so I can help with any uncertainties.

I can't wait to share this wonderful trip with your child and I'm looking forward to June 2026 already!

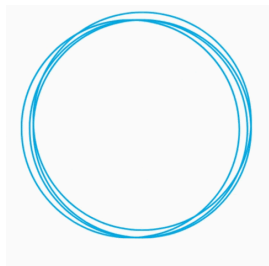
