

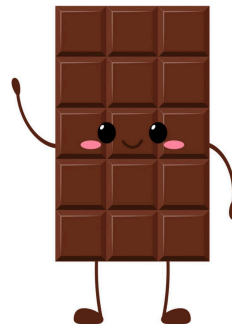

Arts Week 2025 - India

Tuesday 21st - Friday 24th October

We are delighted to tell you that the much-loved CSPA Arts Week is back! The theme for this year is India! This is to celebrate our new partnership with a primary school in Kolkota. Your children will dive into topics such as Indian art, music, food, celebrations, peacocks and much more. They will also join in with one dance workshop, during which they will learn a Bollywood dance.

Arts Week has always proved to be a high point of the year. Each class will spend the day in a different year group from Tuesday to Thursday, having the chance to get to know new teachers, or spend the day with a previous one. On Friday, they will be back in their own class to enjoy a final day together.

No Maths and English homework will be set this week, but each child is asked to complete an Arts Week Diary, showing all that they have learned and experienced during the week. This is to be completed at home, in any way they would like, and brought back into school on the Monday after half term. If your children needs to take any paper home, their class teacher will be happy to provide it. Each child who completes their diary will receive 3 raffle tickets, and have the chance to have it displayed in The Junction.

As we have workshops during the week, and use a range of creative materials, we are asking for a donations of £5 for each child please. You will find this on your Parent Pay account soon. Please could you also ensure your child has a complete pencil case for the week, including a working glue stick, and a large cover-up they can wear over their uniform during any messy activities.

As the children will still be having PE and will all be involved in a dance workshop at some point, please could your child wear their PE kit to school from Tuesday to Thursday.

If you or your family have any links with India, we would love to invite you to come in and share your experiences of Indian culture with us! Perhaps you would be happy to share your favourite clothing, food or part of the country with your child's class. Please speak to their teacher to arrange a suitable time if you would like to come in.

YEAR 4 OSMINGTON BAY RESIDENTIAL TRIP 6TH - 8TH MAY 2026

After another hugely successful visit to Osmington Bay in Dorset with the children of Year 4 last summer we are delighted to be planning a return visit in May 2026.

This will be residential for 2 nights, with the party leaving school on Wednesday 6th May and returning on Friday 8th May 2026.

Whilst we stay at Osmington Bay, the children will take part in a range of exciting activities which could include – archery, abseiling, climbing, zip wire, giant swing to name but a few, all conducted by experienced leaders in a safe environment.

The children's accommodation will be in groups of 4 with en suite facilities for each room. All meals are included with a good selection of hot and cold menus. PGL is able to cater for all dietary requirements.

At this moment in time we need to confirm our booking with PGL. To reserve a place for your child, please could you complete the Google form [CLICK HERE](#) and make a deposit payment of £50 via Parentpay by 1st October. This deposit is non-refundable.

The cost of the trip is £315 per pupil inclusive of travel, full board accommodation and equipment. Should there be any difficulties in making payments, a confidential chat with myself may enable us to secure support where it is needed. If this is the case, please do not hesitate to contact me.

We would ask that the deposit of £50.00 be paid by ParentPay at www.parentpay.com by the 1st October. The deposit is non-refundable. The remaining £265 needs to be paid by 1st April 2026, and we would ask parents to pay at least the minimum instalments by the following dates:

£50 by 1st November 2025

£50 by 1st December 2025

£50 by 1st February 2026

£50 by 1st March 2026

£65 by 1st April 2026

Could I please ask you to respond to say if you would not wish your child to attend. If children do not attend, provision is made in school for them for the 3 days.

Following the meeting for Year 6 parents, I am delighted to confirm with you the provisional details for our Year 6 residential trip with Rock UK to the Summit Centre in South Wales.

The total cost of the trip is £470.

If you would like to reserve a place for your child on the above proposed trip to Wales in June next year, please could you complete a Google form by [clicking here](#) and pay a deposit of £80 via Parent Pay by Friday 24th October 2025.

This will be non-refundable in the event that the trip goes ahead. The remaining £390 needs to be paid by 1st May 2026, and we would ask parents to pay at least the minimum instalments by the following dates:

£80 by the 1st December 2025

£80 by the 1st February 2026

£80 by the 1st March 2026

£80 by the 1st April 2026

Final payment of £70 by the 1st May 2026

In the meeting, I encouraged any families who may be concerned about paying for the trip to contact me confidentially so that financial hardship is not a reason for not joining the trip. There are a few options we can explore together (including alternative payment plans and bursary funds) and I urge you to contact me to discuss further should you need to as soon as possible. You can do so via the school office either by calling or by email.

If you have any questions/concerns and you and/or your child would like to discuss the trip with me, I am very happy to do so.

I cannot emphasise enough what a wonderful trip for the children this is. Not only does it create unforgettable, lasting memories with their friends that really contributes to the final weeks of their CSPA journey, but it also develops skills in the children that aid their transition to secondary school and the next stage of their lives. It is my wish and hope for every child in Year 6 to attend and that no child misses out, so please do reach out to me so I can help with any uncertainties.

I can't wait to share this wonderful trip with your child and I'm looking forward to June 2026 already!

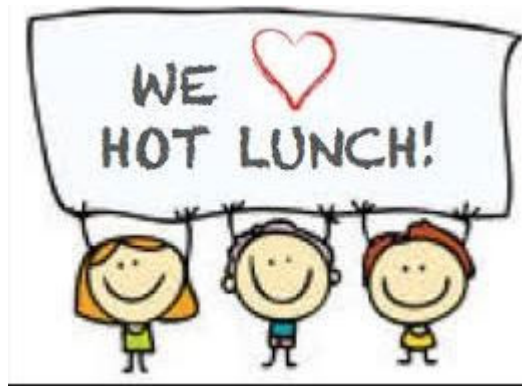

PTA Hot Lunch - Friday 24th October

Our first PTA hot lunch of the year is on **Friday 24th October 2025**.

The hot lunch is kindly being supplied again this time by The Village Chippy in Chalfont St Giles.

As usual, the choices are fishcake, chicken nuggets, plain meat sausage or a vegetarian sausage. All of which come with chips and a Kitkat to follow. If you wish for your child to have a hot lunch please login in to

ParentPay www.parentpay.com, select the 'hot lunch' item stating your child's food preference: fishcake, chicken nuggets, plain meat sausage or a vegetarian sausage in the comments box.

The final deadline for ordering is Monday 20th October, at 9am.

Unfortunately, no orders can be accepted after this date. Please do not request a hot lunch after this date.

The cost of the lunch is £6.50. If you wish to make an additional donation to the school, you can do so by entering a higher amount in ParentPay (see instructions below). Proceeds over and above the cost of the lunch go towards purchasing valuable items for the school. As you know, we are currently fundraising for two projects – the school refurbishment project and the curriculum design project.

When you select the item to make payment, you will see two options:

- Pay full amount (£10.00)
- Choose payment amount

To pay for the hot lunch select 'Choose payment amount' and type the amount you wish to pay into the box (minimum is £6.50, maximum is £10).

Please note if payment is not made, an order will not be placed for your child.

Children are under no obligation to have a hot lunch – some will prefer their usual lunchbox so please do not feel under any pressure to include your child.

If you are entitled to free school meals please ensure that you go onto your Parent Pay account to select your child's meal choice.

I am grateful to one of our former parents, Miss Webster, and other parents as

well as members of school staff for working together to provide this firm favourite for the children.

PTA News October 2025

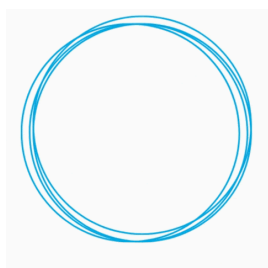
