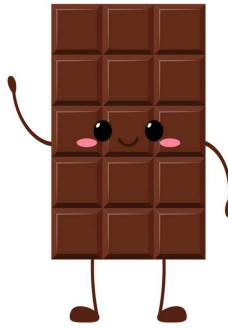

Year 3 - Iron Man DT Project

We will be studying The Iron Man by Ted Hughes in English this term, and are planning to complete a Design and Technology project, designing and building our own Iron Man junk models over the coming weeks. We will be building these on Monday 1st December, and we therefore have a few requests:

1) Please start cleaning and saving up some of the items below. If there is an item that your child particularly wants to use in their own model, please ensure their name is written on it. Your child can bring this in from the week before (24.11.25):

- Plastic milk cartons / bottles
- Bottle tops from eg. milk/juice/squash/water bottles
- Egg boxes
- Pots from eg. yoghurt, cream etc. (small and large)

- Cardboard boxes (cereal boxes, juice cartons, boxes of varied sizes/shapes)
- Kitchen roll tubes (toilet rolls cannot be accepted for hygiene reasons!)
- Tubes from inside foil/cling film/baking paper/wrapping paper
- Plastic tubs from fruit/veg (eg. grapes)
- Any other junk that you believe may be suitable (please do not bring in anything that has stored meat or nuts, no glass, and nothing with sharp edges eg. tin cans)

2) If you are able, please provide a full roll of tin foil and a roll of masking tape for your child - again, these can be brought in from the week before.

A couple of notes...

Your child will most likely come home with their finished model, so it is preferable if they do not have boxes which are too big - they do also find it difficult to work with larger boxes!

In previous years, we have had several bags full of junk remaining after the activity which we have been unable to dispose of in school due to the quantity, so please be aware your child may return home after the activity with some of the junk to be recycled at home.

Thank you, as ever, for your support with all our activities and projects - we couldn't do these things without the help we receive from you all!

Year 6 Production - 'A Fairytale Ending'

Here is an update of key information about this year's production:

The dress rehearsals for performing to the rest of the school and invited Year 2 children and staff from CSP Infant School are on Wednesday 3rd, Thursday 4th and Friday 5th - all performances are during the school day in the afternoon.

Helen Rayner will be taking photographs of the children on stage in their costumes on Friday 5th December. The photographs will then be available with secure online access for you to order should you wish to. More information will follow.

There are 3 performances for families - Tuesday 9th December at 7pm, Wednesday 10th December at 7pm and Thursday 11th December at 7pm. Tickets, for those who have requested them, will be coming home with the children today. More information will follow in a letter to Year 6 parents next week but for your information, the children will be expected back in school at staggered times (unless there is a car-share arrangement) from 6pm. The shows start promptly at 7pm. Parents collect their children usually at about 8-8:15pm. Once we do a full run through of the show, I will know how long it is and can therefore include more accurate timings in my letter next week.

There will be no charge for tickets, however we will welcome any kind donations to the school through a cash collection at the end of the performances.

Please contact me via the school office, if you do not wish for your child to have a professional photograph.

Likewise, if you do not want your child to wear make-up or face paints, please contact me via the school office.

All costumes should start to come into school from Monday 1st December and the deadline is Wednesday 3rd December. Costumes should be on a hanger with any loose items in a carrier bag, hung over the hanger. The whole costume should have a cover over the top and your child's name clearly written in the front.

In the interests of safety, children over the age of one year, accompanying parents, must have their own seat/ticket, however if possible could parents try and make alternative arrangements for young children.

Ticket requests must be made via the Google form (link in the email sent out last week) by Tuesday 2nd December. If you do not return your request by this date, we will assume you are unable to attend any of the performances and any remaining tickets may then be offered to parents, as additional tickets, on a first come first served basis.

We are really looking forward to sharing this special performance with you.

Christmas Jumper Day

All children are invited to wear a festive Christmas jumper to school on Friday 12th December for 'Liberty's Legacy'. All donations will go towards raising vital funds for life-saving research into Ewing Sarcoma, an aggressive bone cancer.

As many of you know, Liberty was once a CSPA pupil and sadly passed away from Ewing Sarcoma in 2017. Please help her memory live on, and help others by taking part and giving generously. Please bring in any donations in cash on the day.

Hot Lunch

Our next PTA hot lunch will be on the same day, Friday, 12th December.

The choices are fishcake, chicken nuggets, plain meat sausage or a vegetarian sausage, all of which come with chips and a KitKat to follow. The children will still need to bring their own drink and are actively encouraged to also bring a small vegetable accompaniment such as cucumber or carrot sticks.

The cost of the lunch is £6.50. If you wish to make an additional donation to the school, you can do so by entering a higher amount in ParentPay. Proceeds over and above the cost of the lunch go towards purchasing valuable items for the school. As you know, we are currently fundraising for two projects -- the school refurbishment project and the curriculum design project. Children are under no obligation to have a hot lunch -- some will prefer their usual lunchbox so please do not feel under any pressure to include your child.

Please note if payment is not made, an order will not be placed for your child.

If you are entitled to free school meals please ensure that you go onto your Parent Pay account to select your child's meal choice.

Unfortunately, no orders can be accepted after this date.**

We will be taking card payments.

Class 1: Boxes or bars of chocolate and or sweeties!

Class 2: Beauty and wellbeing– i.e. New Nail varnishes, nail files, face masks, sponges, bath bombs, lotions, lip balms, nail brush, scented soaps, flannel, bath oils, scented candles, body oil/scrubs etc.

Class 3: Jars – i.e. Jams, honeys, chutneys, preserves, spreads, hot chocolate, syrups.

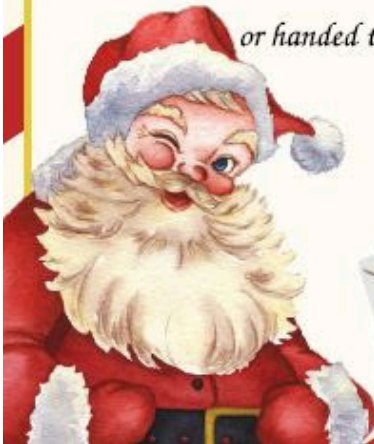

Dear parents and carers,

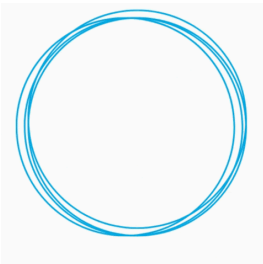
