Parking and safety around the school

Please carefully consider how you approach the school in your cars. A number of Year 6 children now walk to school on their own and I share concern with parents that it should be safe in order for them to do so. Please drive slowly, and with care and thought. Please do not park in Corden's Close, next to the Church Lane car park, and do not turn your car around at this point either. Please use the car park, as the majority of parents do, to ensure a safe arrival and departure at drop off and pick up.

School staff try to be present to ensure safety, but if everyone followed the same expectations, it would be so much easier and safer of course! I will again reach out to the council and our PCSO. I have also asked for signs to promote better parking and driving choices around the school.

May I also add that we are getting complaints about parents parking at the end of the road along Church Lane and again from the local residents of Adstock Mews where parents are parking in their private spaces. I shouldn't be having to deal with complaints from our local community and would appreciate your

support please.

We are pleased to let you know that, to celebrate Safer Internet Day this year,

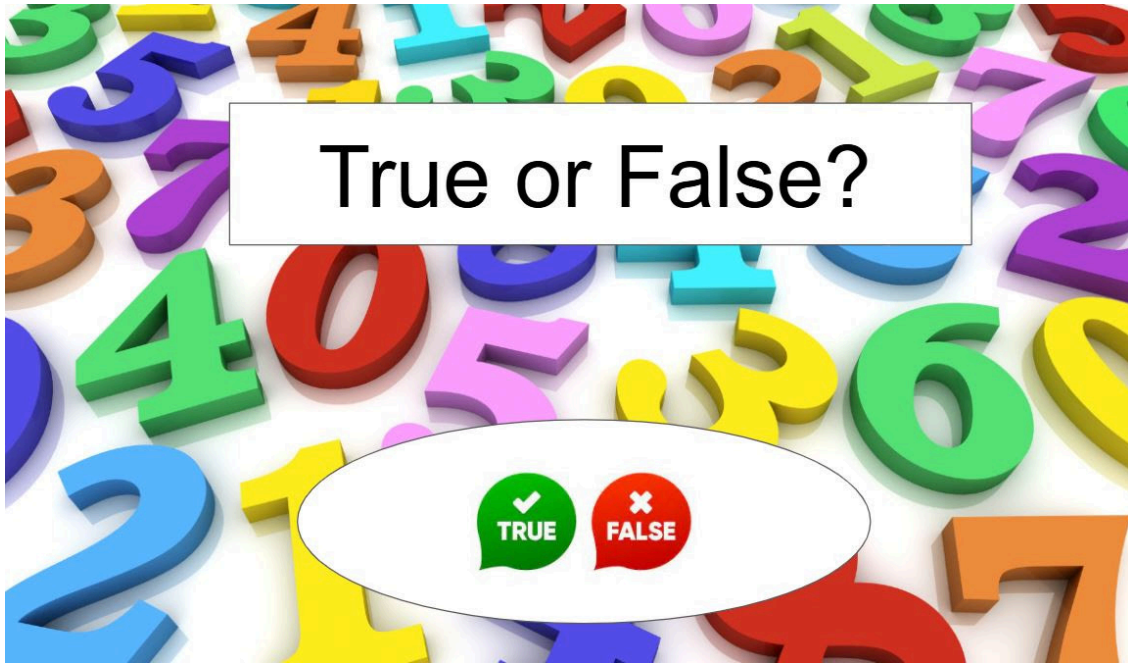
we have organised a special workshop for all pupils across the school on Thursday 26th February.

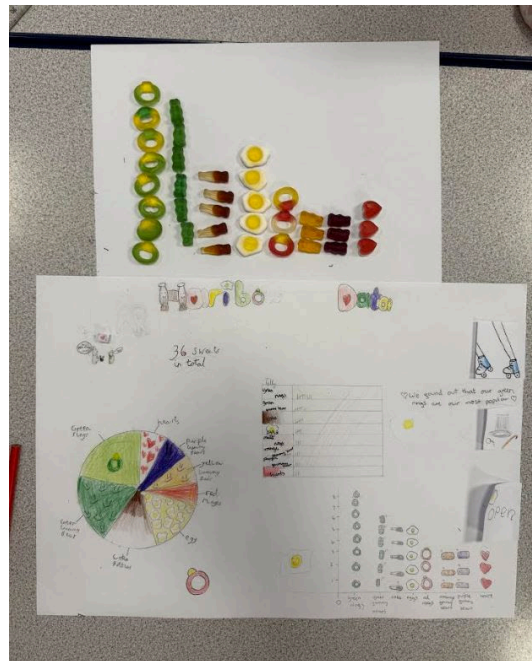

Year 6 World War Two Workshop

Last week, we had a fantastic time during our World War Two workshop, which brought history vividly to life for the children. The children received first-hand expert knowledge from Gareth, who led the workshop and shared his impressive understanding of the era. The children learned how first aid was carried out on injured soldiers during the war, as well as how ARP wardens and members of the public worked together to put out fires caused by incoming bombs to limit damage to cities. They also had the exciting opportunity to observe and handle a wide range of genuine WWII artefacts. Gareth's engaging and detailed storytelling helped the children understand the WWII timeline and the significant impact the war had on all those involved. It was a truly fantastic day and a wonderful, fun, and interactive way to enhance our learning about World War Two. Thank you to our parents and carers for contributing to the workshop – your support makes experiences like this such a valued part of the children's learning.



Year 6 - 3D Structures Maths Challenge!

This week, Mrs Finn's Maths group took on the challenge to create a 3D structure within an hour. The groups built with all the different 3D shapes that they had learned how to make, which included hexagonal prisms, dodecahedrons, square based pyramids, tetrahedrons and triangular prisms. 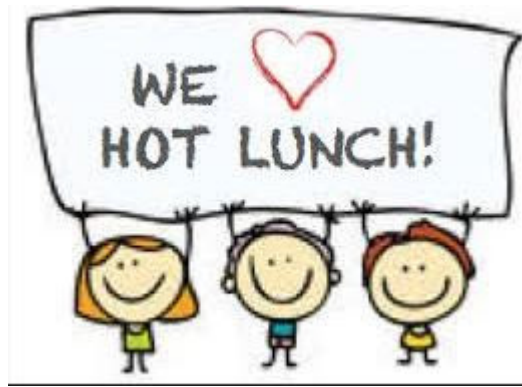
PTA News

Unfortunately, no orders can be accepted after this date. Please do not request a hot lunch after this date.

The cost of the lunch is £6.50. If you wish to make an additional donation to the school, you can do so by entering a higher amount in ParentPay (see instructions below). Proceeds over and above the cost of the lunch go towards purchasing valuable items for the school. As you know, we are currently fundraising for two projects – the school refurbishment project and the curriculum design project.

When you select the item to make payment, you will see two options:

- Pay full amount (£12.00)
- Choose payment amount

To pay for the hot lunch select 'Choose payment amount' and type the amount you wish to pay into the box (minimum is £6.50, maximum is £12).

Please note if payment is not made, an order will not be placed for your child.

Children are under no obligation to have a hot lunch – some will prefer their usual lunchbox so please do not feel under any pressure to include your child.

If you are entitled to free school meals please ensure that you go onto your Parent Pay account to select your child's meal choice.

I am grateful to parent Miss Cole, and other parents as well as members of school staff for working together to provide this firm favourite for the children.

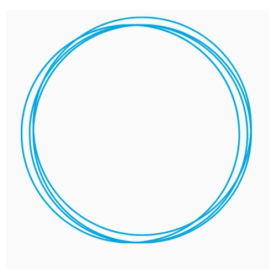

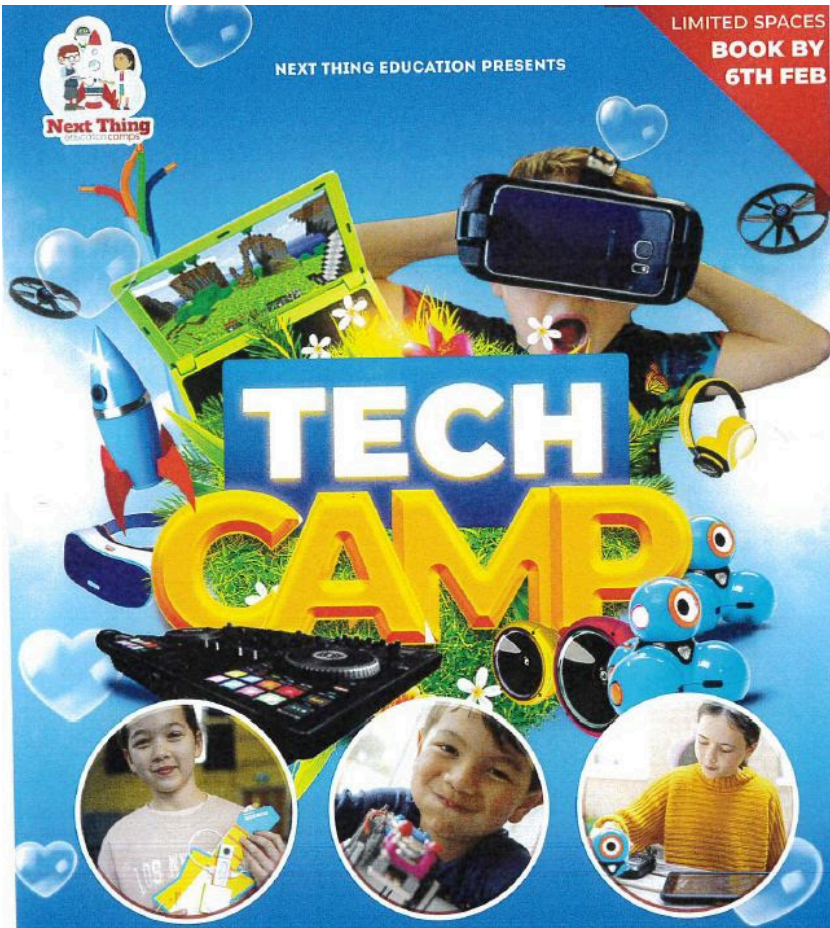
