Message from Mr King, Chair of Governors

National League Tables. Celebrating CSPA's Success

Last week Mrs Alburg drew your attention to CSPA's very high rankings in nationally produced school league tables when compared with other Buckinghamshire schools. Statistics are sometimes a bit dry and hard to understand so governors have asked me to add a little more colour.

The key headlines are that there are three local schools which perform consistently highly every year across all the main performance indicators for exceptional schools. CSPA is one of those and is particularly effective at ensuring that all children make abnormally good academic progress. In short, there is hard evidence that children who come to CSPA receive a broad-based, high quality education, suited to their needs and abilities so that every child can thrive and make very good progress, better than the norm in schools across the County. and the country.

This does not happen by accident. It is the result of hard work by highly professional staff working collaboratively with a passion that every child should achieve their full potential. As governors we have been actively supporting and monitoring the continuing development of our curriculum and how it is being delivered year group by year group and class by class. The success derives in large part from careful planning and inspirational management:

1. Every subject has a teacher designated as subject leader for the delivery of that subject throughout the school. The senior leadership team provides staff with training opportunities and time away from the classroom to ensure that all subject leaders are fully versed in the latest best practice in their subject area and have time to turn it into specific plans for subject delivery in each year group.
2. Year group teachers meet very regularly as teams to discuss and share best practice in delivering every subject in considerable detail, often lesson by lesson. This gives consistency but, even more important, the shared expertise of three or more teachers on what can make any lesson most effective and inspirational.
3. The Head and Deputy Head between them work with every teacher every term to encourage and support them, to help them evaluate their teaching, to suggest any additional training and to offer advice and expertise on how staff can reach the highest standards in every class. This is an ongoing programme of continuous improvement.

How do we know this? We know this because governors conduct a structured programme of reviewing every subject every year. This involves reviewing policies, meeting curriculum leads, observing lessons and talking to pupils about what they have learned. With other governors I have recently reviewed English, History and Computing. Each review was exciting and inspirational. Lessons were clearly planned, resources well prepared for a range of abilities, they were of consistently high quality across year groups, sequential across the years and highly interactive. I noted particularly the major use of very good resources now available through advances in technology which enable pupils to become actively involved and learn in ways which suit them, including reinforcement work for those who find learning takes longer, and challenging extension resources for those who learn at a faster pace.

I wish that every parent could see this first hand in the way that I am privileged to be able to. As a next step we hope to produce a small number of snapshot videos of current classroom practice and post them on the website to allow you to experience your child's learning. This may take a little time for us to produce but please watch this space.

I want to thank Mrs Alburg and Mrs Valentine for their leadership in this area and every member of the teaching staff and every learning support assistant for their professionalism and passion to produce these results. As a grandparent with a grandchild in the school, I am confident in the high quality of education. CSPA provides.

Thanks go too to all parents and carers. None of this could happen without your commitment and support. Educating your children is a partnership. We need your support in every way. Hopefully we will meet each other at the Spring Fayre tomorrow.

Children's use of screens and smartphones

Today I have written to parents to share some headlines from the parents' survey which 135 of you completed around the topic of children's use of smartphones and screens.

Main Headlines

- Most children have access to a screen with the most popular devices being tablets, smart TVs and gaming consoles. Children mostly use screens primarily for entertainment and for learning.
- Most parents use rules such as time limits, content restrictions and parental controls to keep their children safe when using screens.
- Most parents feel that screen time has a negative impact on their child, impacting mainly on their mood and behaviour, closely followed by impacting on their attention and focus

Parents shared concerns about the following:

- Peer pressure to own a smartphone
- Fearing isolation of their child from peers
- Addiction to screens
- Impact on behaviour and social skills
- The difference in parental approach
- The introduction of social media
- Harmful/inappropriate content
- Children's perception of reality verses what they see on screens
- Instant gratification provided by screens
- The inability to enjoy non-screen activities

- Impact on mental health
- Friendship issues

Parents would appreciate clear guidelines and recommendations, more information about parental controls and apps, advice from school or professionals and workshops or information.

Next Steps

1. I would like to set up a parent voice group to work with me to inform and support others within our school family. I believe that a unified approach is the best way forward to lead and support families and generate the greatest impact on our children. If you can spare the time, have some knowledge and a strong passion around this topic. Please highlight your interest in being part of the group via the google form linked below.
2. We have invited Andy Cockburn from the Smartphone Free Childhood movement to speak at CSPA on Thursday 23rd April at 7pm in our school hall (. Families from Chalfont St Peter Infant School will also be invited. I cannot urge you enough to join this meeting. Year 3 Upcoming Activities

We have a few activities coming up in year 3 - please note the following and let

Year 3 Ancient Greek Day

We are excited to let you know that on **Thursday 26th March**, the year 3 children will be taking part in an Ancient Greek day, to bring our learning in History and English this term to life. There is no cost to parents, as this is an internally-organised activity day.

There will be lots of activities throughout the day for them to have a go at, including practical activities and arts and crafts, and they will also have the opportunity to taste some typical foods that would have been part of the daily life of the Ancient Greeks (eg. pomegranate seeds, olives, feta cheese, pitta bread...). We will ensure that no nuts are present in the food provided, but if you have any concerns regarding allergies or intolerances for your child, please do get in touch with your child's teacher to discuss these. Please still provide lunch as usual for your child on this day, as the food will just be little tasters.

We would also like to invite the children to **dress up** for the day. There are many ways that Ancient Greek costumes can be fashioned out of bed-sheets or old pillow cases, or they may wish to come as a particular Greek God or Goddess, a philosopher, mathematician or a soldier - be as creative as you wish, we can't wait to see what you all come up with! The children will be taking

part in an 'Olympic Games'-style games lesson on the field (weather-permitting) during the day, so please ensure they have trainers with them, as it may still be muddy! They may wish to wear comfortable clothes underneath their costume for this too, but it is not a necessity.

If children have an after-school club where they will need their PE kit, they can bring their kit with them and we will give them time to change before the end of the day.

We hope this will be a fun and memorable way for the children to learn about Ancient Greece in more depth. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to get in touch.

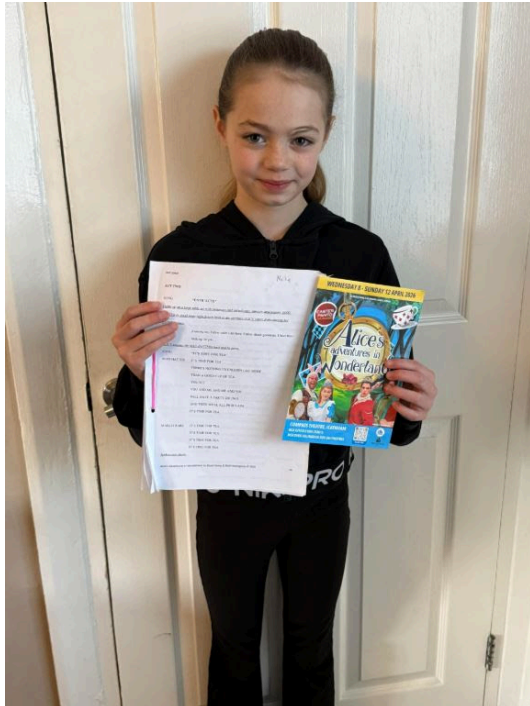

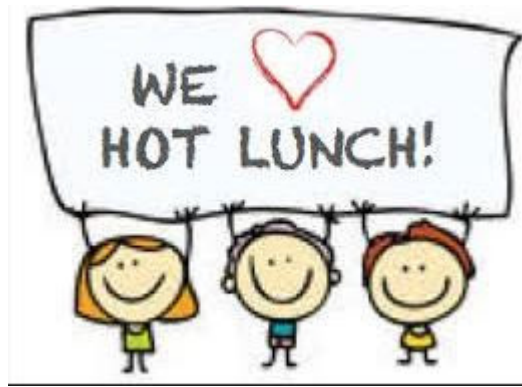

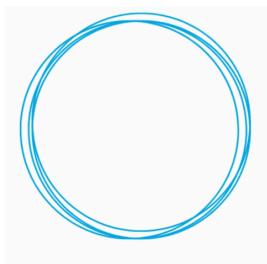
