Planned Roadworks - Market Place, Chalfont St Peter

It has been brought to our attention that Buckinghamshire Highways will be carrying out footway reconstruction works along Market Place, Chalfont St Peter, from the High Street roundabout to Greggs/Bishops House.

The works are programmed to take place from Monday 27th April and it is anticipated the footway works will take approximately 27 days to complete, using a 24 hour footway closure. Multi way temporary lights and a temporary footway in the carriageway will be provided.

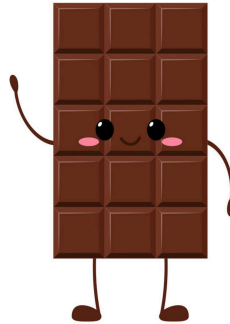

PTA Sponsored Event Friday 22nd May (afternoon)

This year's CSPA Sponsored Event is on the afternoon of Friday 22nd May. This is a multi-activity afternoon whereby children choose to do a particular activity and be sponsored for completing 10 of that named activity to help raise money for the school. For example, if they have chosen to complete 10 dances, they might be sponsored £5 as a full amount for completing all of the dances or perhaps 50p for each dance completed.

The sponsor form will be coming home with your child today. The children are currently choosing their activity and this will be confirmed early next week. Next week, we will remind parents and children if they need to wear their PE kit or school uniform and if they need anything else.

We would ask that your child's sponsor form and money (in a named envelope) are returned to school by Friday 5th June.

This special event will not only provide children with a fun afternoon but will also help to raise funds for the school so we can reach our target of £20000 and be able to further our refurbishment project in the remaining areas. If each child was able to get £10 of sponsor money, it would raise over £3000 for the school!

At the end of the Sponsored Event at around 2:45pm, we would like for the children to enjoy a well deserved extra-playtime with their friends and some squash and a biscuit. If you would be able to help set up these refreshments, please let me know by responding to this email.

The children are excited to enjoy a fabulous afternoon and play their part in helping to raise money for the school.

Year 3 CATs

We are writing to inform you that next week (w/c 18.05.26), all year 3 children will be taking part in the CAT4 tests. These will be completed electronically, and will take place during the school day.

The Cognitive Abilities Test (CAT4) is a diagnostic assessment that is designed to help pupils and their teachers understand how they learn and what their academic potential might be. It assesses how pupils think in areas that are known to make a difference to learning.

While many other tests focus on a child's attainment in core subjects, CAT4 is designed to give schools a much broader, more rounded view of each child, their potential and how they learn. Results help teachers decide about the pace and style of learning that is right for a student, and whether additional support or challenge is needed.

Tasks involve figure classification, verbal classification, number series and figure recognition. There is no preparation required for these, and all the

instructions and information will be given to the children as part of the test.

You will receive the results of these as part of your child's annual CSPA report in July, and you may find these helpful to gain an understanding of your child's learning profile, too.

Year 6 Wales Trip 2026 - Meeting for Parents

Please may I remind you that on Thursday 21st May at 7pm there is a meeting for parents about the upcoming Year 6 residential trip to Wales. The meeting will be held in the school hall. Please arrive via the Church Lane entrance and the school playground and NOT the main school office entrance as it will be closed.

The meeting will give you all of the final details regarding the trip and it will therefore be important for you to attend. If you unavoidably cannot attend, there will be some information shared on the school website.

In addition, I would like to remind you about the arrangements for providing us with medication your child may need during the trip. Thank you for completing the Google Form which has provided us with more up-to-date information. If you think you may have omitted to share something with us, please do so as soon as possible. Please may I ask you to note the following:

- All medication must be named and in the original packaging.
- Medication might include travel sickness pills.
- A form should be completed to allow us to administer any medication. This can be downloaded from our [website](#) and should be handed in with the originally-packaged medication.
- All medication should be handed in to the school office by Wednesday 3rd June at the very latest. However, we would appreciate **medication coming in from next week, prior to half term** to help us be organised.

If you have any questions or concerns about medical needs, please speak to myself or Mrs Lown.

Secondary Transfer Test - Information for current Year 5 parents

Your child will have brought home an envelope before Easter containing

information from Bucks about the Secondary Transfer Test (11+). Please note that this process is starting earlier than in previous years but the deadline for applying for secondary schools is still 31st October.

The envelope contains two letters:

1. A letter personalised for your own child informing you about the process to register to receive your child's result by email or the option of how to withdraw from the process.
2. A leaflet describing the timeline.

Please ensure you read the instructions carefully as there is a deadline of 2nd June to register or withdraw. Please also keep copies of these letters.

Mrs Valentine will be sending an email after Easter with information about the application process for modifications to the secondary transfer test which a few children may be eligible for.

Please also note that Mrs Alburg will be holding a meeting for Year 5 parents on Thursday 18th June at 7pm in the school hall to further share information about:

1. The secondary school application process and
2. The secondary transfer test (11+)

The meeting will be in two parts to allow parents to only attend the first part should they have decided for their child not to sit the secondary transfer test.

The final deadline for ordering is Monday 18th May, at 9am. Unfortunately, no orders can be accepted after this date. Please do not request a hot lunch after this date.

The cost of the lunch is £6.50. If you wish to make an additional donation to the school, you can do so by entering a higher amount in ParentPay (see instructions below). Proceeds over and above the cost of the lunch go towards purchasing valuable items for the school. As you know, we are currently fundraising for two projects – the school refurbishment project and the curriculum design project.

When you select the item to make payment, you will see two options:

- Pay full amount (£12.00)
- Choose payment amount

To pay for the hot lunch select 'Choose payment amount' and type the amount you wish to pay into the box (minimum is £6.50, maximum is £12).

Please note if payment is not made, an order will not be placed for your child. Children are under no obligation to have a hot lunch – some will prefer their usual lunchbox so please do not feel under any pressure to include your child.

If you are entitled to free school meals please ensure that you go onto your Parent Pay account to select your child's meal choice.

I am grateful to Miss Cole, Mrs Lade and other parents as well as members of school staff for working together to provide this firm favourite for the children.

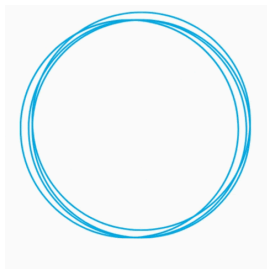
