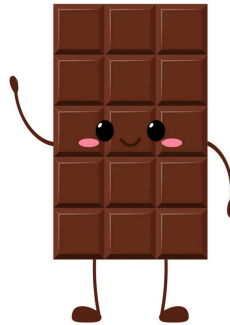

Planned CSPA Premises Development Projects

I am delighted to share with you some further premises development projects we have been planning for over the past few months which will be completed in the upcoming months. These works will help us continue to provide a safe, secure and high-quality learning environment for all pupils. I am grateful to Mrs Hughes and Miss Little, our school business managers, for their ongoing expertise, hard work and dedication towards these projects.

Security Improvements at the School Entrance

During the half-term break, we will be carrying out a significant programme of security improvements at the school entrance. These works are a key priority for school leaders and governors and form part of our ongoing commitment to

maintaining a safe, secure and welcoming environment for pupils, staff and visitors.

The improvements will include:

- installation of new security gates and railings
- construction of a covered canopy from the entrance gates to the front door
- installation of a new video-entry security system
- upgraded fob-entry access systems at both the main entrance and playground door, replacing the existing keypads

These enhancements will strengthen site security, improve access control and support safer visitor management procedures. The new gates and video-entry system will be operational after half term.

Water Distribution Project

We will shortly begin a major project to replace the school's ageing domestic water system, including pipework, fittings and valves throughout the building. This work will provide a safer, more efficient and reliable hot and cold-water supply across the school site.

Contractors will begin installation work during the half-term holiday. To minimise disruption to teaching and learning, the majority of the work during term time will take place out of school hours. The project is expected to be completed during the Autumn Term.

We are delighted to have secured funding for this project through the Department for Education's Condition Improvement Fund. Previous successful bids have enabled us to complete several significant improvements across the school, including:

- replacement of the boiler and heating system
- electrical rewiring works
- fire safety improvements
- flat roof refurbishment
- window upgrades

Year 6 Refurbishment

We are also pleased to confirm that refurbishment of the Year 6 area will take place during the summer holidays. This is the largest and most extensive refurbishment project undertaken so far due to both the size of the year group and the structural work required. The project will include the removal and replacement of flooring, sinks, cloakroom areas and fitted furniture in Classes 10, 11 and 12.

As well as modernising an area of the school that is now outdated, these improvements will help create calmer, quieter and more purposeful learning

spaces that better support pupils' learning and wellbeing. Staff and governors are extremely grateful to the PTA for their continued fundraising and support towards this important project.

PTA Sponsored Event Friday 22nd May (afternoon)

We would ask that your child's sponsor form and money (in a named envelope) are returned to school by Friday 5th June.

This special event will not only provide children with a fun afternoon but will also help to raise funds for the school so we can reach our target of £20000 and be able to further our refurbishment project in the remaining areas. If each child was able to get £10 of sponsor money, it would raise over £3000 for the school!

As you know, Year 3 children have completed their CATs this week. As a reminder you will receive the results of these as part of your child's annual CSPA report in July, and you may find these helpful to gain an understanding of your child's learning profile, too.

Thank you for completing the Google Form which has provided us with more up-to-date information. If you think you may have omitted to share something with us, please do so as soon as possible. Please may I ask you to note the following:

- All medication must be named and in the original packaging.
- Medication might include travel sickness pills.
- A form should be completed to allow us to administer any medication. This can be downloaded from our [website](#) and should be handed in with the originally-packaged medication.

- All medication should be handed in to the school office by Wednesday 3rd June at the very latest.

Year 5 Hampton Court Trip

We are excited to inform you that on Thursday, 18th June, Year 5 will be visiting Hampton Court Palace as part of their learning. This will link directly to their Tudor history topic, allowing them to walk in the footsteps of monarchs such as Henry VIII and Elizabeth I and those who served them.

The children will also take part in an exciting interactive workshop, giving them an opportunity to get hands-on with artefacts and gain a deeper insight into Henry VIII.

To ensure a smooth departure, please ensure your child arrives at school promptly at 8:30 am, as we will leave just before 9:00 am.

What Your Child Will Need:

- A packed lunch (advised in a disposable carrier bag so the children do not have to carry it throughout the day).
- A raincoat in case of wet weather.
- Two drinks (as there will be no facilities to refill bottles).

Pick-Up Time & Location:

Please note that we will return to school slightly later than usual, and collection will be at 4:15 pm from the bottom playground.

The cost of the trip is £30.50, which has been added to ParentPay.

Secondary Transfer Test - Information for current Year 5 parents

Your child will have brought home an envelope before Easter containing information from Bucks about the Secondary Transfer Test (11+). Please note that this process is starting earlier than in previous years but the deadline for applying for secondary schools is still 31st October.

The envelope contains two letters:

1. A letter personalised for your own child informing you about the process to register to receive your child's result by email or the option of how to withdraw from the process.
2. A leaflet describing the timeline.

Please ensure you read the instructions carefully as there is a deadline of 2nd June to register or withdraw. Please also keep copies of these letters.

Mrs Valentine will be sending an email after Easter with information about the application process for modifications to the secondary transfer test which a few children may be eligible for.

Please also note that Mrs Alburg will be holding a meeting for Year 5 parents on Thursday 18th June at 7pm in the school hall to further share information about:

1. The secondary school application process and
2. The secondary transfer test (11+)

The meeting will be in two parts to allow parents to only attend the first part should they have decided for their child not to sit the secondary transfer test.

Meriet Duncan - Author and Beekeeper

On **Friday 26th June**, we are having a visit from Meriet Duncan 'The Queen Bee'. She is a beekeeper, author and speaker, who will be coming in to speak to the children about bees and how important they are to our world. 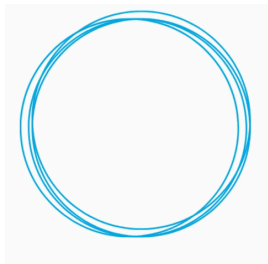
