## **Children's use of screens and smartphones**

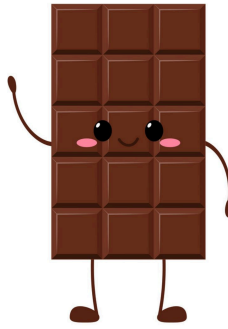

## Free School Meals

You may be aware of the changes to children's eligibility for Free School Meals which are taking effect from September 2026.

Since April 2018, the Department for Education have provided a Transitional Protection to make sure that children would not lose their eligibility for Free School Meals when parents are transferred from other benefits to Universal Credit. The Transitional Protection will be closed by the Department for Education at the end of the Summer Term so all parents will need to re-apply for Free School Meals (FSM) before the start of the Autumn term in September if you would like your eligibility to continue.

Going forward there will be two categories of eligibility, Targeted and Expanded.

Parents in receipt of the following benefits will be entitled to FSM for their children under the Targeted category -

- Universal Credit and the household income is below £7400 per year as assessed by HMRC
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Income Based Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Families eligible under the No Recourse to Public Funds criteria (NRPF)

Children eligible through the Targeted category will be entitled to Free School Meals, be included in funding provided to schools for Pupil Premium and will be eligible for Holiday Access Fund vouchers (while the scheme is provided).

Parents in receipt of the following benefits will be entitled to FSM under the Expanded category -

- Universal Credit and the household income is above £7400 per year as assessed by HMRC

Children eligible through the Expanded category will be entitled to Free School Meals only.

**If you are in receipt of one of the benefits mentioned above please complete the Google Form by [clicking here](#) by Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> July so that we can check your eligibility for either Targeted or Expanded Free School Meals from September 2026.**

**If your child is already in receipt of Free School Meals we require you to complete the Google Form please.**

For both types of eligibility, we will need to recheck your claim(s) once per school year.

## **NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme.**

I am pleased to inform you that we are participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme over the next few weeks. Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand

abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. The assemblies and activities will take place in class groups next week.

Year 5 and 6 children will have a follow up workshops on 10th July which are run by NSPCC Volunteers.

Please let us know if your child may have experienced anything (in the past or happening now) which may mean they need extra support before, during or after taking part in this programme.

We will also be covering the NSPCC 'Talk PANTS' rule with the children, Talk PANTS is a simple conversation to help keep children safe from sexual abuse with the focus on introducing the important underwear rule.

## **Year 6 Young Entrepreneurs**

Young Entrepreneurs is an entrepreneurial awareness and skills enhancement club for children in Year 6. Many of your children have expressed a keen interest in taking part in the scheme this year, which is great news!

The sale itself will take place from 3:20-3:40pm on Thursday 9th July.

In order to join the scheme, the children need to organise themselves into groups and develop an innovative, home-made product that they can sell at a profit. Once the group has been established and an idea agreed, they will need to create a prototype to share with Year 6 staff in the style of a Dragon's Den sales pitch! Smaller groups will be amalgamated (selling their own products but splitting the budget and sharing a table from which to sell their produce on the afternoon of the sale).

If successful, each group will be given either a £15 or £30 investment (depending on size of group) in order to purchase the supplies to make their chosen product. The product itself will need to be made outside of school, but the children will have time during Wednesday lunchtimes (in Class 11 ) to get together to create their advertising campaign and get organised.

If your child is interested in joining the scheme, please encourage them to finalise their groupings and create a prototype ready to bring into school sometime this week or by Monday 22nd June at the latest (during which time sales pitches will be made).

The profits from any sales are pumped back into treats for the current Year 6 children to enjoy.

We very much look forward to seeing what fantastic ideas the children come up with and wish to thank you, in advance, for the support that will be needed should your child wish to join the Young Entrepreneurs scheme.

## **Year 4 Visit to Chiltern Open Air Museum**

We are delighted to let you know that we have arranged a trip for Year 4 to the Chiltern Open Air Museum on **Friday 10th July**.

During the visit, the children will take part in three exciting workshops linked to our Science topic this term: **Aquatic Habitats**, **Woodland Habitats**, and **Owls and Owl Pellets**. These sessions will provide valuable opportunities for the children to extend their learning in an engaging and memorable way.

The cost of the trip is **£15.00 per child**, which covers museum entry and participation in all three workshops. Payment should be made via **ParentPay**.

To help keep the cost of the trip as low as possible, we kindly ask parents and carers to arrange transport to and from the museum. Children should arrive at the museum by **10:00am** for a prompt start and be collected at **2:15pm**. They will not need to attend school before or after the visit. If arranging transport presents any difficulties, please contact the school office as soon as possible.

Further details about appropriate clothing will be provided closer to the date, as this will depend on the weather forecast. Children should bring a small bag containing a packed lunch and a drink, and may also need a waterproof coat if wet weather is expected. We will send a reminder of these arrangements nearer the time.

## Year 3 - Forthcoming Events

### **Meriet Duncan - Author and Beekeeper - TO BE REARRANGED**

On **Friday 26th June**, we are having a visit from Meriet Duncan 'The Queen Bee'. She is a beekeeper, author and speaker, who will be coming in to speak to the children about bees and how important they are to our world. It is always a fantastic event, and the visit supports our learning about plants and pollination in science. (There are no live bees as part of the visit!). We are asking for a donation of **£3.70** per child for this. This has been added to your ParentPay.

On the day, there will be the opportunity to purchase one of Meriet's books, which she will sign for them. **If your child wishes to buy a book**, they should bring the correct amount for their chosen book in a sealed, named envelope. There will not be any change available. The cost of the books are:

*Betsie Valentine and the Honourable Honeybee* – £7.99 (recommended for children aged 10+)

### **Visit to Verulamium (St Albans)**

On **Monday 13th July**, we will be visiting Verulamium in St Albans to enhance our learning about the Romans. Each class will take part in a workshop at the museum, spend time looking at the exhibits in the museum, and will go across to see the mosaic and hypocaust in the park.

A permission form and further details for the day has been emailed but we wanted to ensure you had the date for your diaries. This school trip will take place during the school day so normal drop off and pick up times apply. Children may wear their PE kits for comfort and should bring a packed lunch with 2 water bottles. The cost of the visit is **£21.25** per child, and this has been added to your ParentPay account.

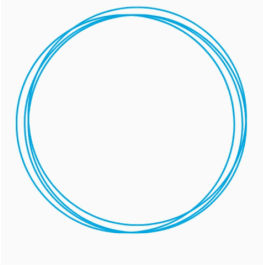
