I wish you all a sunny and happy weekend! Don't forget that school closes on Wednesday 22nd July at 1:30pm.

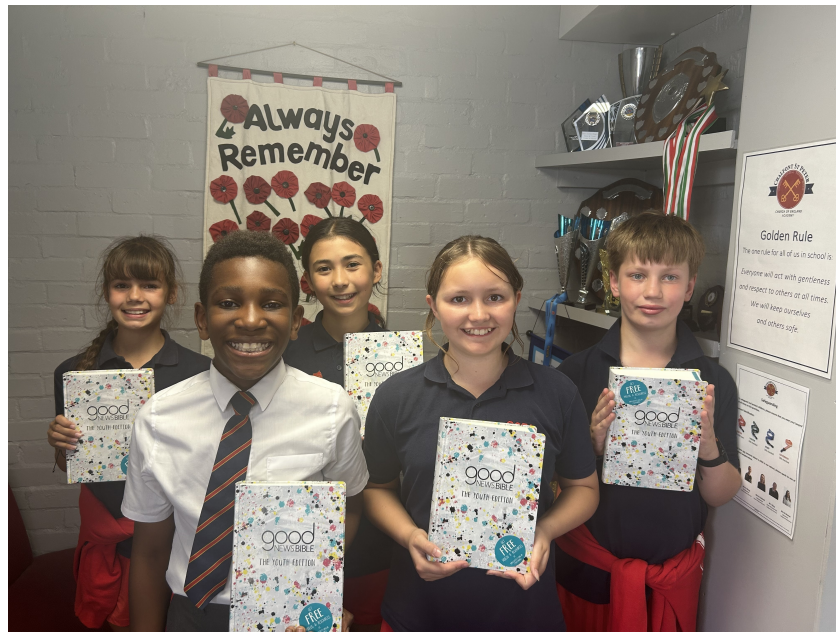

Year 6 Presentation Assembly and Last Day

- If you are attending the Year 6 Presentation Assembly on Wednesday morning, please arrive at 9am and wait outside Gold Hill. We have been asked by the Children's Commissioner to signpost families to 'The Big Future', a survey to gather children's thoughts and views. Please see her message below:

As Children's Commissioner, I am writing to ask you to ensure all of your children complete my new survey, [The Big Future](#).

Under the Children Act 2004, it is my role to promote the views and interests of children in England, and I have done this so far by conducting the two largest

ever children's surveys: The Big Ask and The Big Ambition.

Now, for the first time, hundreds of thousands of children will be eligible to vote in the next general election, the biggest change to the franchise in half a century. Yet just one in five children say politicians listen to them. That's why I'm launching my final survey, The Big Future.

Your children should complete the survey here: <http://www.childrenscommissioner.gov.uk/thebigfuture>.

I want to make sure that I hear from as many children as possible, aged 0-18, from all backgrounds, in all schools and colleges, and in every part of the country. To do that, I need your help.

I am asking children about the changes they want to see in their communities, their biggest concerns, and their hopes for the future. More than anything, I want to know what they think a good childhood should look like today.

The deadline for completing the survey is Friday 23 October.

I will be publishing my findings next year, and they will be used to advocate at the highest level for solutions that children want to see, to the problems that they tell me are most important to them.

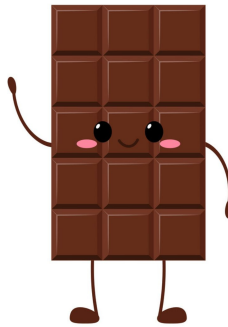

Instrumental Lessons

To enable us to plan for the next academic year, we need to gauge the interest of children wishing to continue with their keyboard lessons with Mrs White and to know whether there are any other children who would like to start lessons from September 2026.

Lessons take place during the school day and from September 2026 the cost will be £315 for the year. If you take up the offer of a place in September, you are committing to pay for the whole year, although you will be able to pay this in termly instalments via ParentPay according to the following schedule:

- £105 by 30 September 2026

- £105 by 31 January 2027

- £105 by 30 April 2027

From time to time children may receive individual lessons, for example to prepare for exams. There will be an additional charge for this, Mrs White will contact parents in advance to discuss if this becomes appropriate for your child.

During our self-guided tour of the museum, we explored a range of Roman artefacts, incredible mosaics and learnt how people lived nearly 2,000 years ago. We also took part in an exciting workshop where we dressed up as Romans and completed a shopping challenge, finding items from a shopping list and discovering their fascinating uses in everyday Roman life.

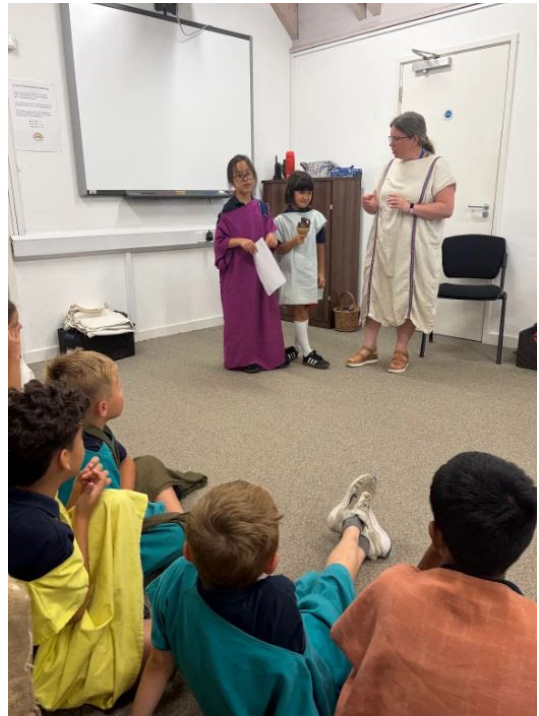
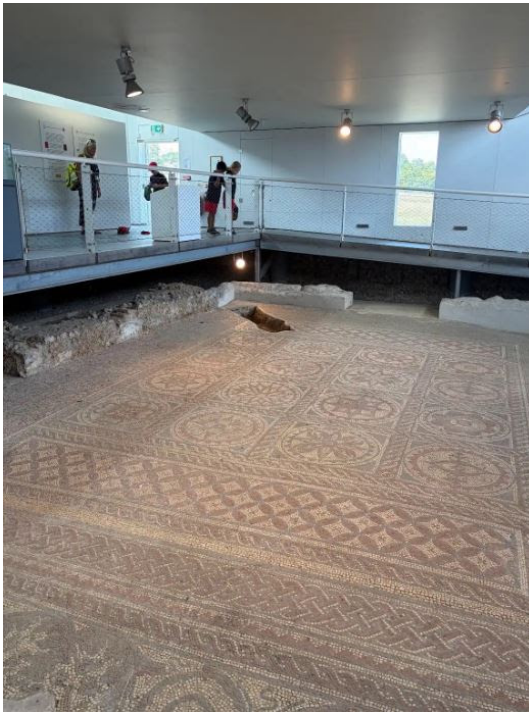

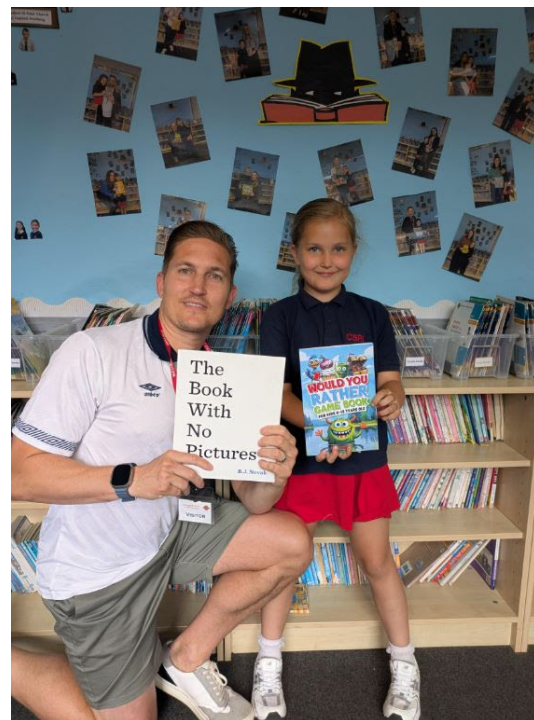




Year 3 Mystery Readers

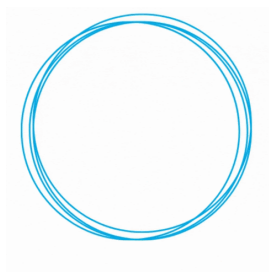
