Please ensure all items of clothing, including coats and sportswear, are clearly named.

Children must wear sensible black school shoes without high heels or sling-backs for their safety in school and at play. It is not permitted for trainers to be worn to or from school, or during the school day, except at break-times.

No jewellery should be worn in school, except for earrings.

The wearing of earrings is discouraged. If parents do choose to send their children into school wearing earrings, they must be plain gold/silver studs only.

Children participating in PE, sports clubs or physical activities should not come to school wearing earrings on those days. If they do, pupils will be asked to remove their earrings and put them into their school bag.

There may be some exceptions to the wearing of jewellery which include medical or religious reasons. If this is the case, a written request should be sent to your child's class teacher.

If your child has hair long enough to be tied, it must be tied back for school.

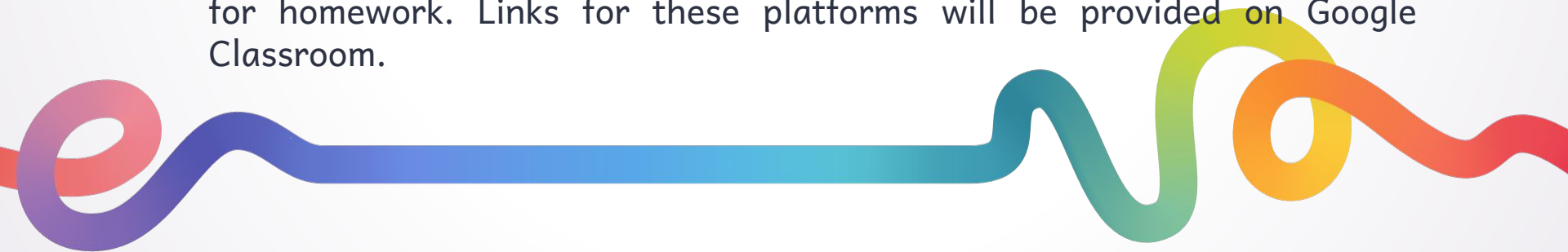
