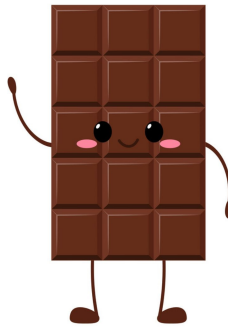

We are thrilled to be opening our doors and welcoming parents into school for another chance to be part of your child's CSPA journey.

To ensure that we do not exceed the hall's capacity and be compliant with fire regulations, we ask that a maximum of two members of each family attend the assembly. Siblings not of school age can attend but will need to sit on adults' laps. There is no need to register your attendance, please just arrive at 9am via the school office. Please note that the rest of the school will have the opportunity to also enjoy the assembly at a later time that morning.

We look forward to seeing you and welcoming you to our class assemblies.

Parking and Safety

I am concerned for the safety of our families when they arrive to drop off and at pick up at the end of the day. Parents are driving too fast along Church Lane, turning around in Cordens Close and parking where they shouldn't be which has already led to concerned parents and complaining numbers - understandably so.

Please may I remind you that in order to keep our children and families safe when arriving and leaving school, we ask that you do not park in Cordon's Close or on the double yellow lines (the police have checked and issued fines in the past), but instead use the Church Lane Car Park. All parents have been emailed a permit from the school office, which allows you to park for 45 minutes at drop off and pick up times without having to get a ticket. The safety of our children is paramount - reversing and driving so close to the school, where children are crossing the road is very dangerous. Please support us to keep everyone safe!

May I also ask you to respect our neighbours along Church Lane by not walking along or sitting on their garden walls.

Parent Pay

Letters were sent home last Friday to all Year 3 parents. Please see details of instructions below to activate your account. Please do this as soon as possible.

To ensure the smooth running of clubs, music lessons, activities and trips at Chalfont St Peter Academy we use a secure online payment website called ParentPay. Parents are asked to make all payments to school via the ParentPay website rather than sending cash or cheques into the school office.

New to ParentPay?

You will need to create your secure online account by visiting www.parentpay.com and using the unique activation username and password which will be sent home via a letter with all new Year 3 children and emailed to other new families. You will then be prompted to change these to something more memorable and private to you. If you have two or more children at a ParentPay school, you only need to activate one account to create your 'main account' and then add your other children via the **Add a child tab** on your home page.

Already have a ParentPay account?

If you already have a ParentPay account, either with our school or another ParentPay school, you can simply login to that account and add your other children via the **Add a child** tab on your home page. You will need the activation username and password to do this.

Please visit www.parentpay.com and activate your account via the **Account login** area on the home page of the site.

ParentPay holds an electronic record of your payments to view at a later date. Once you have activated your account you can make online payments straight away.

Please do not hesitate to contact the school office if you need assistance. Your support in using ParentPay will help the school enormously, thank you.

Year 3 - Times Tables Rockstars Day

We are emailing to let you know about an exciting day we have planned for our year 3 children. On **Friday 9th October**, we will be holding a Times Tables Rockstars Launch Day. This is a day where we will celebrate all things times-tables, but with a twist - the children can dress up as a rock-star, and we will spend time showing them the website (fondly known as TTRS!) and setting up some friendly competitions throughout the day.

There is no charge for the day, it is simply a fun day to launch TTRS and get the children excited about learning using the site. The children can dress up as a well-known rock-star, or become their very own version of a rock-star - we

can't wait to see what you all come up with!

The games they play on TTRS are tailored to each child's needs - when they first log in, there will be a baseline test for the children, and the site uses an algorithm to ensure the correct level of questions are being asked for each child.

Your child should have their TTRS log in stuck into their reading record, and a letter will have been sent home informing you of how to log in, but if there are any questions about this, please do let us know! Please see the letter attached which has more information about TTRS games, and about getting the most out of TTRS for your child.

Having a secure knowledge of their times tables is vitally important to children's progression in maths, and we have found that TTRS is a helpful and engaging way to encourage them to practice their skills. Children should ideally know their 2x, 5x and 10x tables by the end of year 2, and in year 3 we focus on 3x, 4x and 8x tables. They should aim to know these fluently and quickly, without needed to count up (although counting up is a great way to start!).

Please let your child's teacher know if you have any questions about the day, or about how to support your child with their times tables learning at home.

We can't wait to see all our rock-stars in a few weeks' time!

Parent Guide



We recommend a "little and often" approach; 3 minutes practice a day, 4 or 5 times a week is a good target.

What are the different Game Modes?

Single Player

Jamming 4 or 8 coins/correct answer	The only game mode without a timer, players chose the table and operation ($\times$ or $\div$ or both) they want to practise. Answer 10, 20 or 30 questions.
Gig 10 coins per correct answer	Gig games last 5 minutes and contain up to 100 questions, which come in 'waves', starting with the 10s, then the 2s, 5s, 3s, 4s, 8s, 6s, 7s, 9s, 11s and 12s. Novices are not expected to get past the 5s. Gigs provide the child (and their teacher) with a simple measure of their current skills, which is why learners should concentrate fully for the whole Gig as they won't get another try until next month.
Garage 10 coins per correct answer	Players are given a personalised set of 6 multiplication questions (and their matching division questions) in each round. The questions they get keep adjusting to provide the best fit for every learner's needs. This is probably the best game made for improving their recall while they're still learning.
Studio 1 coin per correct answer	Here your child earns their Rock Status, which is based on their Studio Speed. The faster they are the better their status. Studio Speed is the average of their most recent 10 Studio games. Suitable for confident players.
Soundcheck 5 coins per correct answer	Soundcheck games ask 25 multiplication questions (up to 12×12), allowing 6 seconds for each question. Suitable for confident players.

Multi Player

Festival 1 coin per correct answer	Children compete against others from around the world, with their identities protected behind their rock names. Suitable for confident players.
Arena 1 coin per correct answer	Children race against other members of their class who are logged in and choose the same arena name at the same time. Arena games use the same smart question algorithm as Garage games.
Rock Slam 1 coin per correct answer	Players challenge their classmates or teachers to answer as many questions as they can in 60 seconds, setting a score for the challengee to beat. Pupils don't need to be online at the same time.
Tournaments	Battle of the Bands – groups of children within the same school (usually classes, year groups or teams) compete to have the highest <i>average</i> score per player. Top of the Rocks – like a Battle of the Bands <i>between</i> schools. The winning class or school is the one with the most correct answers per person. Important: Each correct answer (in any game mode) earns 1 point towards the team's total in addition to the coins earned. For example, in Garage games each correct answer is worth 1 point for the team and 10 coins for the player.

Learners with different needs

How can I hide the timer?	Start a game and press ⚙ > Hide Practice Clock. You could also play a game in Jamming.
How can I increase the length of Garage games?	Single player > Garage > press the little arrow below "play solo" > choose 1, 2 or 3 minutes.
The tables are too hard	Make sure your child is playing in Garage or Arena game modes. If this does not resolve the issue, please speak to your child's teacher. Remember that Jamming mode allows the child to choose the tables themselves.
My child gets anxious	Try the three above plus: setting mini goals (e.g. complete 2 minutes today, get 1 more point in the next game, pass 1 level); having a break from online play (come back in a couple of days); and reminding them of Baz's words: "A good rock star stays chillaxed by accepting they make mistakes."
My child has visual impairments; what settings are available?	Head to the Profile page where you can: change the colour scheme; reduce the visual stimuli with Declutter mode; increase the font size or switch to a dyslexia-friendly font called Lexie. play.ttrockstars.com is also screen reader compatible.
Can I turn off division?	Yes in Jamming mode but not in the other games. The reason for that is that practising multiplication and division at the same time supports the recall of both and is the most successful approach. If your child is finding division confusing, please speak to their teacher about starting with the 10s only and for advice on how to help at home.

Troubleshooting

My child's coins and/or Studio speed have suddenly dropped	Another child may have logged in as your child. Please reassure your child that this can be rectified. Contact their teacher who can set a new password, refund any coins, delete Studio games and talk to the class about online safety.
My child plays too much	Set firm TTRS time limits; reward healthy choices; take away devices before bed.
My child's name is showing on a school leader board.	Please ask your child's teacher to change the settings at their end so that rock names show on the leaderboards instead of real names.
What does the ⚡ mean?	If this symbol appears over a game tile (e.g. over Garage) it means the teacher has set your child a certain number of minutes to practise in that game mode for homework. Once they complete those minutes the other games unlock.
Is TTRS safe?	Yes. There are no adverts, no in-app purchases nor any chat functions. See more in our Privacy Notice (mathscircle.com/privacy-notice).

Year 4 Residential Trip to Osmington Bay - May 2027

After another hugely successful visit to Osmington Bay in Dorset with the children of Year 4 last summer we are delighted to be planning a return visit in May 2027.

This will be residential for 2 nights, with the party leaving school on Wednesday 5th May and returning on Friday 7th May 2027.

Whilst we stay at Osmington Bay, the children will take part in a range of exciting activities which could include – archery, abseiling, climbing, zip wire, giant swing to name but a few, all conducted by experienced leaders in a safe environment.

The children's accommodation will be in groups of 4 with en suite facilities for each room. All meals are included with a good selection of hot and cold menus. PGL is able to cater for all dietary requirements.

At this moment in time we need to confirm our booking with PGL. **To reserve a place for your child, please could you complete the Google form [here](#) and make a deposit payment of £80 via parentpay by 1st October. This deposit is non-refundable.**

The cost of the trip is £320 per pupil inclusive of travel, full board accommodation and equipment. Should there be any difficulties in making payments, a confidential chat with myself may enable us to secure support where it is needed. If this is the case, please do not hesitate to contact me.

We would ask that the deposit of £80.00 be paid by ParentPay at www.parentpay.com by the 1st October 2026. The deposit is non-refundable. The remaining £240 needs to be paid by 1st March 2027, and we would ask parents to pay at least the minimum instalments by the following dates:

£60 by 1st November 2026

Following the meeting for Year 6 parents, I am delighted to confirm with you the provisional details for our Year 6 residential trip with Rock UK to the Summit Centre in South Wales.

In the meeting, I encouraged any families who may be concerned about paying for the trip to contact me confidentially so that financial hardship is not a reason for not joining the trip. There are a few options we can explore together (including alternative payment plans and bursary funds) and I urge you to contact me to discuss further should you need to as soon as possible. You can do so via the school office either by calling or by email.

If you have any questions/concerns and you and/or your child would like to discuss the trip with me, I am very happy to do so.

I cannot emphasise enough what a wonderful trip for the children this is. Not

only does it create unforgettable, lasting memories with their friends that really contributes to the final weeks of their CSPA journey, but it also develops skills in the children that aid their transition to secondary school and the next stage of their lives. It is my wish and hope for every child in Year 6 to attend and that no child misses out, so please do reach out to me so I can help with any uncertainties.

I can't wait to share this wonderful trip with your child and I'm looking forward to June 2027 already!

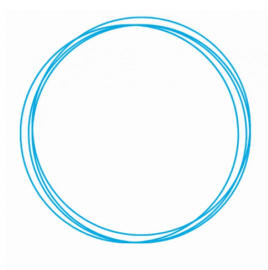
